An Ordinance to prevent the feeding of
stock upon the Public square passed 1st reading
Motion of Coates that the rules be suspended
to permit the Ordinance to pass 2^d & 3rd
reading and final passage, seconded by
Stebb and carried by the following vote yeas
Morgan Stillwell Stebb Coates Transue
Mercer yeas 6 nays 0 the ordinance then
passed 2^d & 3rd reading and vote on its
final passage stood as before yeas 6 nays 0

The Mayor declared the ordinance duly
passed.

Passed 1st reading an ordinance
to provide for the laying of side walk on
Station Street from C. & P. R.R. to South Corporation
line. Motion of Stebb that the rules be
suspended to permit the ordinance to pass
2^d & 3rd reading and final passage
seconded by Morgan with the following
result yeas Morgan, Stebb Coates Transue
Mercer nays Stillwell, yeas 5, nays 1.

The Ordinance then passed 2^d & 3rd reading
and the vote on its final passage was unani-
mous. The Mayor declared the ordinance
duly passed.

An Ordinance to provide for the
laying of side walk on Market Street passed
1st reading Motion of Stillwell that the

rules be suspended to permit the Ordinance to pass 2nd & 3rd reading and final passage seconded by Transue and carried by the following vote, yeas Morgan Stillwell Webb Coates Transue, Mercer yeas 6 nays 0

The ordinance then passed 2nd & 3rd reading and vote on its final passage stood as before yeas 6 nays 0.

The Mayor then declared the ordinance duly passed.

Motion of Morgan seconded by Webb that the Council sanction Mr Mercer in regard to giving Mr Routsom, the privilege of erecting telegraph poles on Mt Union Street as far as his residence.

Motion Carried

The Mayor then administered the oath of office to the newly elected Councilmen as follows, ~~John~~ Townsend Lf Beardsley Coates after which the old members retired and the new ones took their seats.
