

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND SERVICE TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE LOWEST BIDDER FOR REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO PRIMARY AND SECONDARY CLARIFIERS (PHASE II) AT THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Alliance has been making improvements to its primary and secondary clarifiers at the Wastewater Treatment Plant as a three-phased project; and

WHEREAS, Phase I construction and Phase II engineering are completed; and



that \$435⁰⁰ had been collected in ~~work~~ and money on the poll tax for 1881. Report was accepted.

Mr Mercer offered the following Resolution
Resolved that the Solicitor be directed to take such legal action as should prevent any obeluction of the streets of the City by any Rail Road Company or passing over the Streets after the passage of this Resolution seconded by Stillwell and carried by the following vote, yeas Townsend Stillwell Boardely Coates
Tranmer Mercer yeas 6 nays 0

The Mayor declared the Resolution duly passed. Motion of Stillwell that the City Solicitor be instructed to prepare an Ordinance for the gas of the City Marshall leaving the amt of salary blank for the present.

Mr G. B. Marchand was present and stated that he would like the Council to take some action in regard to his petition for yearly licence for Opera House.

Mr Mercer moved that the present ordinance in the matter stand seconded by Stillwell. A vote was taken on the matter all voting in favor except Boardely who thought the price too high in comparison with other cities.

Motion of Tranmer that a watering be placed from Water Bakery to the Rail Road on Main Street to prevent people from falling off. on motion the matter was referred to side walk Com.

Motion of Mercer that a watering trough be placed near Isaac Pector's property in Freedom seconded by Tranmer and carried. On Motion Council adjourned.
