Alliance O May 4th 1882

Council Convened as to Adjournment

Mayor Johnson presiding

Roll Called. Present Lee, Shaffer, Ruth, Coats
Beardsley Townsend.

The question of straightening South Liberty Street by removing the offset beginning at the Corner of the Jenkins Farm was suggested by Mr. Ruth and on Motion referred to the Street Committee.

The proposition made by John Grimsey in behalf of the Citizens of South Liberty to grade the street at their own Expense if the Council would establish the grade was considered, and on Motion of Beardsley seconded by Lee that the Council furnish the grade as desired and the on South Liberty Street and that the Citizens be allowed to grade said street - Motion Carried.

The Committee appointed to confer with the Austin Stone Company asked more time to report

Orders having been previously drawn to amount of \$109.95 for payment of said bill It was moved by Coats and seconded by Lee that an additional order of \$5.16 be drawn on the treasurer for payment of said bill in dispute - Yeas & Nays called, resulted as follows. Yeas Lee, Ruth, Coats. Nays Shaffer, Beardley, Townsend. Yeas 9 Nays 3. Mayor voting yea - declared the Motion Passed.

An Ordinance ✓

Fixing the rate of Taxation and the distribution of the Same for 1882 Passed 1st reading and on Motion of Coats & seconded by Beardley that the rules be suspended to permit the Ordinance to pass second and third reading & final passage Yeas & Nays being called resulted as follows Yeas Lee, Shaffer, Ruth, Coats Beardley, Townsend Yeas 6 Nays None The Ordinance then passed second & third reading and the vote on final passage stood as before Yeas 6 Nays none. The Mayor declared the Ordinance Passed

On Motion of Coats and seconded by Beardley that the Ordinance defining and Prohibiting Nuisances & providing for the Abatement of Same Passed Second reading Motion Carried

Mr Townsend offered the following Resolution Resolved, that the fire department be instructed to locate
