rules to Permit the Ordinance to Pass
Second & Third Reading, and final
Passage Yeas & Nays Called, Yeas, Lee
Shaffer, Ruth, Coats, Beardsley, Towns-
end Yeas 6 Nays 0. The Ordinance
then passed 1st & 3rd Reading ^{the vote on} &
Final Passage stood as before Yeas
6 Nays 0 - Mayor declared
the Ordinance duly Passed

To prevent fast riding or driving within the limits of the Incorporated Village of Alliance. Passed 1st reading And on Motion of Coats & Seconded by Beardsley that the rules be suspended to permit the Ordinance to pass 2nd and 3rd reading and final Passage. Yeas 4, Nays Called - Yeas Lee Shaffer Ruth, Coats, Beardsley, Townsend - Yeas Nays None The Ordinance then passed 2nd + 3rd Reading. And the vote on final passage stood as before Yeas Six, Nays, None. The Mayor declared the Ordinance duly Passed.
