Williams moved that the ordinance pass it be put on its third & final passage. Seconded by Fawcett & lost by the following vote

 Yeas 2 Nays 4

An Ordinance Entitled an Ordinance to repeal Section 22 of an Ordinance Entitled an Ordinance providing for, and regulating the

Police Department of the Incorporated Village of Lilliance O passed May 19<sup>th</sup>. Passed first reading Silvers moved that the rules be suspended to permit the Ordinance to pass to its second & third reading and final passage. Motion Carried and the vote on its final passage stood as follows Yeas Williams, Silver, Hawes, Hays, Stanley, Staffer, Lee Yeas 3 Nays 3. Mayor declared the Ordinance lost.
