On Motion of Williams Seconded by Stanley that the Clerk be requested to notify J W Gillespie & J G Garrison that their propositions for Printing had been accepted.

Silvers moved that the matter of buildings encroaching on Streets and Allies be referred to Committee on Streets and Allies with power to Act. Seconded by See and Carried.

An Ordinance to prevent the running at large or being loose within the Corporation of certain Animals therein named.
