Silvers Moved that the matter of removing the Watch-house located near the crossing of the C. Y. & P. & P. F. W. & C. Railroads, be referred to the Committee on Streets with power to act. Seconded by Shaffer and Carried

The Police force at present in our opinion, not being sufficient therefore, Be it resolved, by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance that the present force be increased to three and that immediate steps be taken to carry this resolution into effect

Resolution to pave Arch Street

Be it resolved by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance Ohio that in its judgement it is necessary to grade and pave that part of Arch Street, lying between the South Side of Main Street and the North line of Rosenberg Street, and therefore Be it resolved that the same be done - Moved by Shaffer Stanley + Seconded by Lee that the resolution be adopted A yeas & Nays vote was called with the following result Yeas Stanley Silver Shaffer, Lee, Nays Hawcett - Yeas 4 Nays One - The Mayor declared the resolution passed
