 the Noble and heroic work in holding the
 fire in Check and Assisting in the search
 for bodies entombed in the debris of the
 Orr Miller, and Benford Buildings for
 Six Long hours, until the last body known
 to have perished, had been recovered, notwith-
 standing many of them who were exposed
 to the streams of water were covered with
 ice but would not Relinquish their eff-
 orts in the noble work.

Also Thanks are due our fire Police in
 their noble work in Assisting to rescue
 the body; + Taking Charge of the ruins
 and standing guard over same for 72
 long hours in the rain + cold until
 the last article lost in ruins had
 been recovered and taken charge
 of by the proper persons

Silvers Moved that the Chief of the Fire Department be instructed to make a report by the next regular meeting of the Council of what is necessary for proper working of the Fire Department. Second Fawcett & Carried

Moved by Stanley Second by Shaffer that the Solicitor be instructed to confer with parties having Gasoline on the streets &c. as to their removal. Motion Carried

Fawcett Moved that the Chief of the Fire Department be authorized to procure at once for the use of said department four nozzles 24 Spaniels and one rope. Second by Shaffer and Carried by the following vote Yeas Stanley Williams. Silver. Fawcett. Shaffer yeas Five Nays None

An Ordinance Providing for and declaring the vacation of certain portions of Streets and Alleys therein described. Passed first reading. Silvers Moved to Suspend the rules to permit the Ordinance to pass to second and third reading and final passage. Second by Stanley and Carried by the following vote Yeas Stanley Williams Silver Fawcett Shaffer - Yeas 5 Nays None. The Ordinance then passed Second & third reading and the vote on its final passage stood as before, Yeas 5 Nays
