 Council met in regular Session.

Mayor Johnson being absent
 Councilman R B Williams was chosen
 Chairman pro tem.
 Present Williams, Prescott Galbreath Herr
 Fawcett Stanley
 Minutes of last meeting read
 And approved

Reports

The Committees to whom was referred
 the petitions asking for lamp posts
 located on the corner of fifth + College
 Streets + Corner of Park + Perry Streets
 reported in favor of granting same

Stanley moved that the reports be accepted
 and that the ^{Chairman of the} Gas Committee be authorized
 to erect two posts in accordance
 with the requests of said petitioners
 Secured by Prescott + Carried. Gas Galbreath
 Williams Herr Prescott Fawcett Stanley
 Gas 6 nays none

Fawcett moved that ^{Chairman} the Gas
 Committee be instructed to purchase
 half doz Gasoline lamps same as
 now in use - Secured by Stanley
 And Carried - Gas Galbreath Williams
 Herr Prescott Fawcett Stanley
 Gas 6 nays none

On Motion of Prescott Secured
 by Fawcett A Gasoline Lamp
 was authorized to be located on
 Mt Union Street between Milner
 Street and South Corporation
 Lane - Gas Galbreath Williams
 Herr Prescott Fawcett Stanley
 Gas 6 nays none

The Board of Cemetery Directors
Not being ready to report asked to
be Continued until next regular
Meeting. Granted

Here Moved that the Council
Meet together Tuesday Morning, 8 October
for the purpose of taking into consid-
eration the Matter of Change of Grade
on the North Side of Market Street
West to Rail Road Track - Seconded
by Truscott & Carried

The Committee to whom was
referred the petition asking for a
Change of grade on Columbia Street
asked further time. Granted

Truscott Moved to take up ^{from} the table
the petition asking for the opening of a
Street from Mt Union Street West to
^{through the Simon Hubber farm to}
the Corporation line and that the
same be referred to the Street Committee
Seconded by Salbreath & Carried.

Truscott Moved that the Bill of Joseph
Bell be paid for work performed on
the John Joseph property be paid
Seconded by Stanley - The Chair
Decided the Motion Out of Order
on account of the same being in
the hands of a Committee who
had failed to report.

Ordinance

An Ordinance Entitled an Ordin-
ance to prohibit the Making ~~and~~
Maintenance of Any Structure -
Embankment or filling which
causes water to be collected on Streets
and Alleys. Passed 1st reading

On Motion of Stanley Seconded by Salbreath
 The rules were suspended to permit the
 Ordinance to pass 2nd and 3rd reading
 And final passage. Yeas Salbreath Lullies
 Heer, Truscott, Sawcett, Stanley. Yeas six
 Nays None The Ordinance then passed
 2nd + 3rd reading. and the vote on final
 passage stood as before. Yeas 6 nays
 None

Passed 2nd Reading An Ordinance to Establish
 the grade of Oxford Street

Passed 2nd Reading An Ordinance to Establish
 the Grade of College Street from Arch
 Street East to Morgan Street

Passed 2nd Reading. An Ordinance regulating
 the digging & excavating of Streets &
 Alleys and the removal and disturbance
 of Pavement

Passed 1st Reading to prohibit the Importation
 into this Village of Substances which
 Cause noxious Exhalations or
 offensive Smells

Passed 3rd Reading An Ordinance regulating
 the rate of Speed of Locomotives and
 rail Road Cars within the limits
 of this Village
 Stanley moved to Amend the
 Ordinance by striking out the
 5 miles per hour and inserting
 eight miles per hour. Seconded
 by Truscott & Carnegie
