Proposals for Electric Light
 The Committee to whom was referred
 the Matter of Electric Light
 Submitted the following proposition
 received from Two Companies.
 One from The Morton & Constock Electric
 Company of Cleveland. Who proposes
 to furnish the City with one Waring House
 Engine (25 H P) One 25 H Power Boiler with
 fittings complete & one No 12 Van Dyke
 Dynamo - 12 Standard Lamps of 2000 C
 All ~~each~~ Power each. 3 Masts one
 86 feet & two 102 feet each including
 Cost of Erection & two Miles of
 Wire & Poles. Put the same in running
 order, the Town to provide building
 foundation for Engine & boiler and
 give the required franchise to

Erect masts run wire + place poles, as well as the land for masts &c, for the sum of \$5575⁰⁰

The 2nd proposition ^{from} Thompson Houston Electric Co who proposes to furnish 30 or more Electric Arc lights of a Nominal 1200 Candle Power each of the Thompson Houston Electric System for the term of 5 years for the sum of \$80⁰⁰ each per year said lights to be lighted before dark of each night and burn until 12 o'clock Midnight or per dark of the Moon - Or until the same to burn until 2 o'clock A M not to exceed 24 nights each month for the sum of \$100⁰⁰ each per year

The Third Proposition Submitted by C C Thomson in addition to the propositions from the Thompson Houston Electric Co. To light to enter into contract to light the entire City one year for the sum of \$2400. Putting up lamps until Gas & Gasoline is displaced to the satisfaction of the Council
