Passed First Reading an  
 Ordinance Entitled An  
 Ordinance Providing for

and fixing the Rate of Taxation  
 And Distribution of Same for the Year 1887.  
 Williams Moved that the Rules requiring  
 Ordinances to be read on three different days  
 be Suspended. That the Ordinance be  
 read the 2nd time: 2nd by Smith and  
 Carried Yeas Weybrock Williams Hill  
 Cassaday Smith - Yeas 5 Nays None  
 The Ordinance Passed its Second Reading  
 Williams Moved to further Suspend the  
 rules that the Ordinance be read  
 the third time and Placed on its  
 final passage. 2nd by Weybrock and  
 Carried - Yeas Weybrock Williams Hill

## An Ordinance

PROVIDING for and fixing the rate of taxation and distribution of same for the year 1887.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Ohio, That there be levied for the year 1887, on the real and personal property in said corporation, eight mills on each and every dollar of said property as said property is valued on the tax duplicate.

SEC. 2. That the clerk of the village be and is hereby authorized to certify to the Auditor of Stark county, Ohio, on or before the first Monday in June, 1887, the percentage of the levy as authorized by the first section of this ordinance.

SEC. 3. That the tax authorized by the first section of this ordinance be and the same is hereby distributed among the funds of said village as follows:

- General Fund 3-10 of one mill.
- Sinking Fund 2 3-10 mills.
- Street and Sanitary Fund 1 mill.
- Gas, Gasoline and Electricity Fund 1 7-10 mills.
- Police and Salary Fund 8-10 of one mill.
- Water Fund 1 7-0 mills.
- Fire Fund 3-20 of one mill.
- Prison Fund 1-20 of one mill.

SEC. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

## An Ordinance

To Provide for the Grading and Improving of Main street, between Arch street and west side of Mechanic street.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Common Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, O. -two thirds of all the members concurring- that Main street, between Arch street and west side of Mechanic street, be graded to the established grade, drained and paved, and the sidewalk curbed with suitable curbing stones, according to the plans and specifications on file in the office of the Village Clerk.

SEC. 2. That the cost and expenses of said improvement, excepting the cost and expense of grading and paving all streets and alleys intersecting Main street between the points aforesaid, shall be estimated, levied and assessed upon each and every front of the several lots or parcels of land bounding or abutting upon said street between the points aforesaid, in proportion to the frontage in each.

SEC. 3. That the cost of grading and paving all street and alley intersections upon said Main street between the points aforesaid, shall be paid out of the general tax levied for the use of the Corporation.

SEC. 4. That all claims for damages caused by reason of said improvement, shall be adjusted after completion of same.

SEC. 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

## An Ordinance

To Authorize the Mayor and Clerk of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Ohio, to issue the bonds of said Village, for the purpose of extending the time of payment of the bonded debt of said Village due September 1st., 1887.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, Ohio, that the Mayor and Clerk of said Village be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to issue the bonds of said Village, amounting in the aggregate to nine thousand one hundred and fifty (\$9,150) dollars, for the purpose of extending the time of the payment of the bonded debt of said village due September 1st, 1887.

SEC. 2. Said bonds shall be issued in sums of not less than one hundred dollars and not to exceed one thousand dollars, and shall be issued for a period not to exceed three years, and shall bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per centum, payable semi-annually, the principal and interest of said bonds to be paid at the office of the treasurer of said village. Said bonds shall have interest coupons attached, and be authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and Clerk of said village, and each bond and coupon shall bear on its face the imprint of the seal of said village.

SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and legal publication.
