 Appointed by the Mayor to divide the City
 of Alliance into Wards

To the ^{hon} Mayor & Council of the City of Alliance
 In accordance with your appointment
 of a Committee to recommend a suitable division
 of the City into wards, said Committee would
 respectfully make the following report for the consider-
 ation of Council.

As introductory to said report it has
 been the unanimous desire of your Committee to con-
 sider the following points in suggesting this division.

Ist - Compactness of Wards

IInd - Population

III - Prospective growth.

Which we believe will be attained by the
 the following division.

First. Commencing at the intersection of the the Centers
 of Main and Freedom Streets thence Westward
 along along the Center of Main Street to the
 Corporation line thence Northward and Eastward
 along said Corporation line to the Center of
 North Walnut Street, thence Southward along

The Center of North Walnut Street to the intersection of Said Street thence South Eastwardly and Southward along the Center of Said Street to the place of beginning. Said division to be designated as First Ward.

Second Ward - Commencing at the intersection of the Centers of Main and Freedom Streets, thence Northward and North Westwardly along the Center of Said Street to the intersection of the Center of North Walnut Street thence Northward, along the Center of Said North Walnut Street to the Corporation Line, thence Eastward and Southward along Said Corporation line to the Center of the first Street (not named) North and running Parallel with the P. S. N. & C. R. R. thence Westwardly along Said Street (not named) to the intersection of the Center of North Webb Street. thence Southwardly across the tracks of the P. S. N. & C. R. R. and C. & P. R. R. to the foot and Center of Main Street. thence Westward along Said Main Street to the place of beginning. Said division to be designated as Second Ward.

Third Ward - Commencing at the intersection of the Centers of Main and Seneca Streets thence Eastward along the Center to the foot of Main Street. thence North Eastwardly across the tracks of the P. F. W. & C. R. R. & C. R. R. to the intersection of the Center of North Webb Street and the first Street (not named) North and running parallel to the P. F. W. & C. R. R. thence Eastward along Said Street to the Corporation line to the Center of Liberty Street thence Northward along the Center of Said Street to the intersection of the Center of Milner Street. thence Westward along the Center of Said Street to the Center of Seneca Street thence Northward along the Center of Said Street to the place of

beginning said Division to be designated as Third Ward.

Fourth (Ward) Commencing at the intersection of the Center of Main and Seneca Streets thence Southward along the Center of said Seneca Street to the intersection of the Center of Milner Street thence Eastward along the Center of said Street to the intersection of the Center of Liberty Street, then Southward along the Center of said Street to the Corporation line thence Westward along said Corporation line to the Center of Arch Street, thence Northward along the Center of said Arch Street to the intersection of the Center of Main Street thence Eastward along the Center of said Main Street to the place of beginning said division to be designated as Fourth Ward

Fifth Ward Commencing at the intersection of the Centers of West Main Arch and Main Streets thence Southward along the Center of Arch Street to the Corporation line thence Westward and Northward along said Corporation line to the Center of Main Street, thence Eastward along the Center of Main Street to the place of beginning said division to be designated as Fifth Ward
