

Council Chamber May 14 1888

Council met pursuant to adjournment
 Members present President Penrock Betts Bush,
 Miller Jones Johnson Beck
 Absent Carley Defert Williams.
 Mr Penrock Presiding

Passed Second Reading An Ordinance
 To create the office of City Civil Engineer
 Prescribe the duties and fix the Compensation of
 the Same.

Report of Annexation Commissioners.
 Was submitted and read as follows

Terms of Annexation

To the Councils of the City of Alliance Stark County
 Ohio and Village of Mt Union Stark County Ohio

That the undersigned Commissioners appointed
 by your respective bodies for the purpose of arran-
 ging terms for the Annexation of said Village
 of Mount Union to said City of Alliance have
 agreed upon and hereby make our report as
 follows:

- 1st The Incorporated Village of Mount Union shall
 be admitted into the City of Alliance as a
 separate ward to be known as Mount Union ward
 and shall in all respects have equal rights benefits
 and privileges with any other ward of said City
 of Alliance; and the Council of Alliance shall
 provide for the same as soon as practicable.
- 2nd This Annexation shall in no way affect the ex-
 isting liabilities or rights of the different Corpo-
 rations; but each shall pay the same principal
 and interest on all debts contracted or liabilities
 incurred up to the completion of the Annexation.
- 3rd The Sinking fund for the City of Alliance
 shall be subdivided into three funds. One to
 be called the Old Alliance fund, to pay

all debts and interest incurred by the City of Alliance up to the Completion of the Annexation One to be Called the Old Mount Union fund for the payment of All debts and interest incurred by Mount Union up to the Completion of the Annexation One to be Called the Union fund to pay all debts Contracted after the Completion of the Annexation, Said Sub-funds to be Created for the first levy After the Completion of the Annexation and the Alliance Council Shall Apportion the Levy Accordingly.

4th That until the next Annual ^{Municipal} Election Said Mount Union Ward Shall be entitled to two representatives in the Alliance Council to be selected by the Council of Mt Union in Such Manner as it May See fit

5th All Ordinances Existing in Mount Union at the time of the Annexation not provided for by the Alliance Ordinances Shall Continue in force until rescinded, Amended or otherwise properly provided for by the Alliance Council

6th These Conditions Shall in no wise Affect the Post Office or School district of Mt Union or Alliance.

Wick moved that the report be referred to
 the Solicitor with the request that he consult
 with the Solicitor of the Union. Seconded by
 Jones and Carried

Mr Betts moved that the Solicitor be instructed
 to draft an Ordinance to Amend Section 3
 of an Ordinance Entitled an Ordinance to
 Prohibit Ale Beer and Porter Houses and other
 places where intoxicating liquors are sold
 at retail so as to read as follows

"Any Person or Persons violating any of the
 provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction
 thereof be fined for the 1st offence not
 less than fifty, not more than Two Hundred
 Dollars and for each subsequent offence
 not less than Two ~~Hundred~~^{hundred} not more than five
 Hundred Dollars Seconded by Johnson
 and Carried.

Passed 1st Reading An Ordinance To Amend
 Section 3 of An Ordinance to prohibit ale
 beer and Porter Houses and other places
 where intoxicating liquors are sold at retail

Johnson moved that the Street Commissioner
 be requested to attend all meetings of the
 Council. And that he report at each
 regular meeting of the Council when and
 where work had been performed on
 the streets. Seconded by Bush and Carried

Sewerage

Major Cantine of the Sewerage Commission
 reported verbally their conference with
 Colonel George E. Waring and submitted

to the Council Col Warrings Proposition to prepare a plan of sewerage for the entire City for a cost of about \$650,000 and recommended that he be employed.

Mr Jones Moved that the Sewerage Commission be instructed to take such Preliminary Steps as in their judgement are necessary at the present time with the view of adopting the Plans of Col Warrings Secured by Johnson & Carreel.
