The following notice was read from the Board  
 of Health Alliance O May 30

To the City Council

You are hereby notified  
 to Abate Nuisance on the Alley near North  
 West Corner of Cambridge and Grosvenor  
 Streets in rear of W Funt's Residence  
 in Alliance O Controlled by you.

Said Nuisance Large Consists of large  
 tract of Stagnant water full of filth  
 drained from adjacent territory and with  
 out Outlet. The same being dangerous to  
 public health and you are requested to  
 remove and abate the above within  
 5 days from this date under the penalties  
 prescribed by law. By Order of Board  
 of Health James Bais Health Officer.

### Ordinances

Read the Third time An Ordinance

Resolved that in the opinion of two  
 thirds of the members elected to the Council of the  
 City of Alliance Ohio it is necessary to  
 improve Arch Street from Main Street  
 South to Summit Street by Excavating  
 filling, Grading paving and Constructing  
 the Necessary Culverts drains and  
 retaining walls in accordance with  
 Profiles and Specifications to be placed

on file in the Office of the City Clerk.  
 The Expense of Said Improvement to be  
 Assessed per foot front upon the property  
 Abounding and Abutting thereon according  
 to the law on the Subject of Assessments;  
 the Assessments therefor to be payable in  
 five Annual  $\$$  Installments if deferred  
 and the same Collected as provided by  
 law and in the Assessing Ordinances hereafter  
 to be passed. Bonds may be issued in  
 Anticipation of the Collection of the Assessments  
~~before the same are issued and unless the~~  
 Property owners pay their Assessments before  
 the same are issued and within the time  
 prescribed in said Assessing Ordinance;  
 And the Clerk is hereby directed to Cause  
 this resolution to be published in a Newspaper  
 of general Circulation in the Corporation  
 for the period of two consecutive weeks.
