The Committee to Whom Was referred  
 the Matter of Preparing Plans and

Specifications for Grading and  
 Paving Arch Street Reported as follows

1st. **PAVING.**—Street to be paved with best quality of hard burned fire clay paving brick, to be laid on their edge in rows across street, breaking joints in center of brick. All material and labor to be furnished at contractor's expense.

2d. **GRADING.**—The Roadway to be graded to such a sub-grade and cross-section as the Council and Engineer shall direct. Three (3) inch tile to be placed one (1) foot inside of each curb and two (2) feet below sub-grade. Excavation for tile after same is laid to be filled up to sub-grade with fine gravel. When the sub-grade is properly prepared a bed of ballasting of clean gravel of a quality to be approved by the Council and Engineer shall be placed thereon to a depth of not less than twelve (12) inches. This ballast to be brought to a proper crown similar to that of the finished surface of the street.

3d. **PUDDLING.**—The Roadway to be thoroughly puddled with water at such time and to such extent, during or after the grading, as the Council and Engineer shall direct. The Contractor to furnish all hose and other necessary appliances for, and to do all the work of puddling. The City to supply water at hydrants free of cost to the Contractor.

4th. **STREET SURFACE.**—After street is puddled as aforesaid the same shall be rolled with a heavy roller until it shows a level and solid surface, to the satisfaction of the Council. After the rolling of the street as aforesaid the Contractor shall fill in with clean sand, free from all animal, vegetable or foreign substance, and roll the same to a uniform surface in which to lay the bricks so as to bring them to the proper grade of the street. When the bricks are laid the street shall show a crown or curvature to be designated by the Council and Engineer. As soon as the bricks are laid and before any other material is placed thereon, the same shall be rolled with a heavy roller and then be covered, and all interstices filled in with fine sand well swept in with a wire or splint brush, and then the whole covered with clean, fine sand free from all vegetable, animal or other foreign matter. All dirt or rubbish made or accumulated during the prosecution of the work shall be immediately hauled away at the Contractor's expense, to such points as may be designated by Council, the distance of such haul to be not more than eight-hundred (800) yards.

5th. **CURBING.**—To be of the best quality of hard wearing stone, not less than four (4) inches thick and eighteen (18) inches deep, and in lengths not less than thirty (30) inches, to be set with close joints. The stone to be cut with a three-fourth ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) inch bevel on top, and to be dressed to a uniform surface to a depth of ten (10) inches from the top on the ends and face of the stone. The face and top of the stone to be brought to a straight line by the use of a straight edge. Stones are to be taken out of wind. The curbing must be carefully set to a straight line and to a uniform and true grade and slope back one (1) in six (6) in a full bed of sand or fine gravel and backed up with an eight (8) inch thickness of the same material in the rear. The curb stone are to be thoroughly settled in the earth in front and rear to be tamped to the satisfaction of the Council. To be corner groved one and one-half ( $1\frac{1}{2}$ ) inches at crossings to receive the gutter bridges. Angle blocks of stone at each curb corner twenty-four (24) inches deep with a rounded face, cut to a radius of ten (10) inches, and to be dressed to the same bevel and depth, and set to the same slope as the curbs.

6th. **WIDTH.**—The width between the curb line, including the gutter, to be twenty-eight (28) feet. Gutters to be placed to the curb on each side of the street, same to be paved with same kind of brick as the other part of the street.

7th. **CROSS WALKS.**—Of the best quality of brick, to be laid as Council may direct. Gutter bridges at street and alley crossings to be of iron four (4) feet long, two (2) feet wide and of such pattern as the Council may approve.

8th. **ALL SETTLEMENTS.**—In any portion of the street before the final acceptance of the work by the Council, shall be repaired and made good at the Contractor's expense.

9th. **THE WORK.**—Shall be done subject to the inspection and approval of the Council and Engineer, both as to material and workmanship, and must be completed in.....working days after the signing of the contract.

10th. **ALL MATERIAL.**—Excavated on the street will be classified under one head, "Earth Excavation," and measured in place and all surplus shall be disposed of according to directions from the Council and Engineer, along or near the line of improvement, without extra compensation, to a distance not exceeding eight hundred (800) yards.

11th. **BIDS.**—Will be received for the whole or any part of the labor and materials separately. Council reserves the right to
