 Physicians, in Active practice, or for Exclusively
 Known Mechanical, Pharmaceutical or Sacramental
 Purposes. But nothing herein Contained Shall
 prevent the Manufacturing of intoxicating
 Liquors from the raw Material and the Sale
 thereof at the Manufactory, by the Manufac-
 turer of the same in quantities of One gallon
 or More at Any one time.

Sec 3. Any person or persons violating any
 of the Provisions of this Ordinance Shall, upon
 Conviction thereof, be fined for the first offense
 not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor More than
 two hundred dollars (\$200), and for each Subsequent
 offense not less than two hundred dollars
 (\$200) nor More than five hundred dollars (\$500).

Section 4 That An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance
 To Prohibit ale beer and porter houses, and
 other places where intoxicating liquors are Sold
 at retail," passed Oct 6th 1886, and An
 Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to Amend
 Section 3 of ~~of~~ An Ordinance Entitled An Ordinance
 to prohibit ale, beer and Porter houses
 And other places where intoxicating liquor
 are Sold at retail" Passed June 4th 1888 be
 and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec 5- This Ordinance Shall take effect and be in
 force when ten days shall have elapsed after
 its passage and due publication.

Betts Moved to Suspend the rules requiring
 Ordinances to be read on three different
 days, that said Ordinance be read the
 second time, which Motion was Seconded
 by Johnson, and Carried by the following
 yeas. Pennock, Betts, Bush
 Jones, Johnson, Miller, Vick, William
 Yeas Eight Nays none The said
 Ordinance was read the second

Time. Bush Moved that the rules be
Suspended and that the said Ordinance be
read the third time and put to a vote
on its final passage. which Motion was
Seconded by Betts and Carried Yeas Pennock
Betts Bush Jones Johnson Miller Vick Williams
Yeas 8 Nays none. The said Ordinance
was thereupon read by the Clerk the third
time. A vote was then taken upon the
final Passage of the said Ordinance with
the following ^{result} Yeas Pennock, Betts, Bush,
Jones, Johnson, Miller, Vick, Williams, Yeas
Eight Nays none. The Ordinance was
declared duly passed.

An Ordinance

To Prohibit Gambling was read the second
time. Johnson Moved the rules be suspended
and that the Ordinance be read the third
time. and put on its final passage Seconded
by Bush and Carried. The Yeas & Nays being
called, resulted Yeas Pennock Betts Bush
Johnson Jones Miller Vick Williams Yeas
8 Nays none. The Ordinance was read the
third time and vote on final passage
stood as before Yeas 8 Nays none.

The President declared the Ordinance
duly passed.

An Ordinance

Fixing the time and place of the meetings
of the Council of the City of Allenton
was taken up and read the third
time and on Motion of Bush Seconded
by Williams put on its final Passage
Yeas Pennock Bush Jones Miller
Vick Williams. Nays Betts Johnson
Yeas 6 Nays 0. The President

Declared the Ordinance duly passed

Offered by Mr Vick the following
Resolution

Resolved that the Clerk be instructed
and Authorized to advertise for Sealed
Proposals to be received until Monday
August 27th 1888 for grading and Paving
Arch Street from Main to Summit Street
According to Plans and Specifications
on file in the Office of the City Clerk.
Vick Moved the Adoption of the resolution
2d by Jones & Carrue

Jones Johnson Vick Williams. Yeas 8
Nays None

Johnson Moved that the ~~no~~ vote on the
Motion to adopt the report of the
Arch Street Paving Committee at
the last meeting be reconsidered Second
by Vick and Carrue

Johnson Moved that said report be
so amended as to read, "Brick or Stone"
Second by Vick and lost

A vote was then taken on
the adoption of the original report.
resulting Yeas Perinock Betts Bush
Jones Johnson Miller Vick Williams
Yeas 8 Nays None.

Vick Moved that the City Civil Engineer
be instructed to have Printed the necessary
Amount of the Plans & Specifications
for the Arch Street Improvement
2d by Betts & Carrue

Mr Arney asked the Council to give him
the required grad on certain lots on
Jordan Street. Referred to grade Committee

Offered by Mr Johnson the following
Resolution

Resolved that the City Clerk
be and is hereby authorized and instructed
to have published all Ordinances hereafter
passed by this Council in the Leader and
Standard Review as provided by Law
Providing the Cost thereof shall not exceed
fifty Cents Per Square for each Paper.

Second by Bush & Carrico
Yeas Penrock Betts Bush Jones Johnson
Miller, Vick, Williams Yeas 8 Nay 0 none

On Motion of Johnson Second by
Betts the Solicitor was instructed to
prepare an Ordinance providing for trimming
shade trees.
