Passed Reading Entitled An Ordinance To Assess A Special Tax on The Real Estates Bounding and abutting on Arch Street from South Main

Street South to Summit Street and to issue Bonds in Anticipation of the Collection of Such Assessment.

Betts Moved to Suspend the rules requiring Ordinances to be read on three different days to permit the Ordinance to be read the Second time.

 properly Excavating draining, ~~draining~~ ^{filling with}
 gravel (four inches deeper, than the Original
 Contract with John Antram) for the inter-
 Section of Union Avenue and Main Street
 Mt Union Ward, ^{a space of} 52 feet each way.

An Ordinance

To Amend Section Three of An Ordinance
 To Establish a grade on Arch Street
 Passed May 7 1857 — Was Read the
 1st time. Betts Moved the rules
 be Suspended, and the Ordinance read
 the 2nd time Second by Williams and

Carried Yeas Pennock Betts Bush Early
Jones Miller Sefert Vick Williams

The Ordinance was read the second time
