To The Alliance Street Railroad Company
 You are hereby notified that it has been
 deemed necessary by the Council of the City
 of Alliance Ohio to improve Arch Street in
 said City between Main Street and Summit
 Street by Grading the same and paving the
 road bed with paving brick for a distance
 of at least 28 feet in width setting curb
 and gutter stones and constructing the
 necessary cross walks Culverts and drains
 according to the specifications on file in the
 Clerks office of the City Clerk and that
 the Alliance Street Railroad Company
 its Successors or Assigns will be required
 to pave all parts of the said Street within
 the aforesaid limits lying between the
 rails of its proposed road with paving
 brick in accordance with the plans
 and specifications of said improvement
 on file in the office of the City Clerk
 and to the satisfaction of the City Council
 at the same time that said part of said
 road Street is being so improved by the
 City. Resolved that the Clerk

Cleveland O Oct 1 1888
 To the Council of of the City of all
 Ohio
 Gerollan
 The Alliance Street

Rail way Co being duly Organized held a meeting of its board of directors Sept 27th 1888 at the Office of W W Hazard Cleveland Ohio, at which meeting the Directors of said Railway accepted the franchise of said road as granted by the Council of the City of Alliance, O. At the above named meeting the officers of said Company were instructed to contract for the immediate construction of said railway from the Union Depot to the Center of Mt. Union Ward, and to build an electric motor railway, also to construct said railway on Arch Street, it being understood that the grading and other matters of said Arch Street be made by you in immediate readiness for the construction of said rail road.

As instructed by said Board, we do hereby respectfully notify you of the above action of the Board: Also to notify you to grade, etc., said Arch Street as provided by your ordinance, so as not to delay the immediate construction of said Railway.

Declaring the necessity of grading
Arch Street from Summit Street South
to Main Street in Mount Union Ward.

Be it Resolved by the Council of
the City of Alliance $\frac{2}{3}$ of
of the Members Elected Concurring
that it is necessary to improve

Arch Street in Alliance O., from Summit Street South to Main Street in Mount Union Ward by grading the Same (such improvement being recommended by the Street Committee) in accordance with the grade to be established on said Arch Street. The Expense of Said improvement to be assessed per foot front upon the property bounding and abutting thereon according to the law and Ordinance on the Subject of Assessments; the Assessments therefor to be paid in five Annual instalments if deferred and the Same Collected as provided by law and the Assessing Ordinance hereafter to be passed. Bonds May be issued in Anticipation of the Collection of the Assessments unless the property holders pay their Assessment before the Same are issued and within the time prescribed in Said assessing Ordinance, and the Clerk is hereby instructed to cause this resolution to be published in a Newspaper of general Circulation in the Corporation for a period of two Consecutive Weeks.
