to grade. Referred to Committee on Side

From Citizens residing on Patterson Street asking
for four street lights located East of Webb Street.
Referred to Committee on Public Lights

Petition from Citizens of the Third Ward. asking for a
gasoline lamp to be placed on Liberty Street between
Broadway and College Streets. Referred to Committee
on Public Lights.

Petition from Citizens residing on Broadway and
Freedom Streets asking for an Electric Light
Lamp placed at the intersection of said Broadway
and Freedom Streets. Referred to Committee on
Public Lights.

Petition for 2 Gasoline Lamps
one to on South ^{of Broadway} Liberty Street One on first
Alley South of Cambridge Street and one corner
of Freedom + Grant Streets. Referred to Committee
on Public Lights.

Petition from Residents and property
owners of Linden Avenue & vicinity asking for
a gasoline Lamp located on the corner of
Linden Avenue and Oxford Street. Referred

Ordinances

Entitled An Ordinance to Establish a

a grade on Arch Street between Hester Avenue
 and Main Street Mount Union Ward. Passed three
 readings and on motion a vote was taken
 on its final passage resulting as follows
 Yeas Pennock Bush, Seft Johnson, Williams
 Nays Jones, Miller, Vick. Yeas 5 Nays 3
 Councilman Betts having retired

An Ordinance To Establish a grade
 on Union Avenue between the P & W end
 Chicago Railway and the Center of Main
 Street in Mount Union Ward. was read the
 first time Johnson Moved that the rules
 requiring Ordinances to be read on three different
 days be suspended. that the Ordinance be read
 the second time Seconded by Williams and Car-
 ried yeas Pennock Bush Jones Johnson Miller
 Seft Williams Vick. Yeas Eight Nays none
 The Ordinance was read the second time.
 Vick Moved to suspend the rules and that the
 Ordinance be read the third time and put on
 its final passage Seconded by Johnson
 and Carried yeas Pennock Bush Jones
 Johnson Miller Seft Vick Williams.
 Yeas 8 Nays none. The Ordinance passed
 its third reading and the vote on its
 final passage stood as before Yeas
 8 Nays none. The president declared
 the Ordinance duly passed.

On Motion of Bush the City Civil engineer
 was instructed to locate the grade
 stakes on Union Avenue. Without
 delay. Motion Carried

First Reading An Ordinance to establish
 a grade on Franklin Street.
 First Reading An Ordinance to prevent the defa-
 cement of property

1st Reading An Ordinance to prevent the Obstruction of Side walks with Snow and Slush or ice.

Vick Moved that the Clerk be instructed to serve Notice on the Property Owners of Arch Street from Summit Street to Main Street Mt Union Ward of the passage of the resolution to grade the same. Carried.

Mr Johnson Chairman of the finance Com- reported that a Bond Executed by Mount Union Council Oct 12th 1887 in favor of Mr Anttrim for Side walk purposes ~~was due and due~~ to the Amount of \$48.50 + interest was due and unpaid. And Moved that an Order be drawn on the Treasurer for the amount Secured by Bush and Carried Yeas Pennock Bush Jones Johnson Muller Sept Vick, Williams Yeas 8 Nays none.

Dr Steel Reported the Receipt from Mayor Chapman for Balance on Sale of Barn 17.06
 " " " Side walk for P.F. W & R.R. Co 47.00
 " " " Lumber furnished Mt Union Ward 3.20
 " " " Fines & License 250.00
 \$ 317.26

And asked to have the same Apportioned.

Defered until the next Meeting.

Johnson Moved that the Mayor be instructed to have the Amount \$220.75 received from the Cleveland work house for fines collected from Alliance prisoners Paid over to the Treasurer, and a sufficient Amount be apportioned to pay 2 Orders held by Harten for Court Charges. Secured by Vick And Carried.

Johnson Moved that the Town Hall in Mount Union Ward be selected as the voting place for Ward. - Motion Carried

Bush Moved that the Street Commissioner be instructed to Clean Main Street without Delay Secoed by Jones & Carried.

Johnson Moved that the Street Committee be instructed to procure a sufficient Amount of 18 in tile to drain across Arch Street under the Bridge South of the Rail road Tracks The Rail road Company Agreeing to remove the Bridge and fill over the Tile with Cinders to the proper grade. - Secoed by Seferin And Carried.

Mr Ross addressed the Council in regard to a Change of grade in front and East Side of the property Owned by Miss Manfull. Asking the Council to be at the Expense of removing the surplus of dirt.

On Motion of Bush Secoed by Johnson, that the Side walk Committee Was instructed to remove the dirt to whatever place it was most needed. - Motion prevailed.

On Motion the Clerk was instructed to Advertise One week for bids for furnishing the City buildings with Coal for the coming winter - Carried.

Plat of Highlan Park
