On Motion Reports Accepted

The Special Committee to Whom was referred the Matter of Conference with the Rail Road Officials Made the following report

The Committee to whom was submitted certain propositions made by the Penn R R officials. beg leave to report as follows After an extended consultation with Superintendent Starr and others of the Pennsylvania RR pertaining to grades Crossing and other improvements, a careful review of the whole ground and the points in question find that the Owners of property on South Side of Rail Road and west of Union Avenue have sold to Rail Road Company a wide extended strip of land on each side of on

on west side corporation line for the purpose of
Rail Road yard. After, when completed will virtually
close said road or at least make it a very
dangerous and objectionable road-way.

The Rail Road Co asks Council to lend its
influence to the vacation of so much of said
road as crosses their yards, for which they
will widen Union Avenue under Rail Road
and Culvert the stream under the same and
make a first class passage way in every respect.
Said Rail Road Co also desire a portion of
west end of Patterson street vacated.

Propositions to in any way couple the above
with that of crossing at east end of Main
Street would not be considered by the
R.R. Co. but looking to the mutual benefit
of both the City and the Rail Road. Superintendent
Starr agrees that when ever the City of
Alliance is ready with plans and specifications
for crossing the track at east end of Main
Street the Rail Road Company will then
render the City very substantial aid,
but in no way would grade crossing at
that point be considered.

The Committee would recommend

1st the vacation of street on west
corporation line as listed for on consider-
ation of proposed improvements by Rail
Road Company on Union Avenue

2nd vacation of west end of Patterson
Street after Rail Company has adjusted
all claims of damages by abutting
property owners.

3rd That the Council respectfully ask
the Rail Road Co to reduce the number
of tracks on Hazardous Street crossing
to as few as practicable and provide safety
gates on the remaining.
