Council met pursuant to adjournment

President Pennoek in the Chair

Johnson Moved that the said bills Ordinance be so  
 amended as to include the Bills of J. Conrad  
 for lighting Street Lamps in Mount Union Ward  
 to the amount of \$12.60, to be paid out of the Street  
 lighting fund of said Ward. Also \$2.34 to the  
 said Conrad for cleaning Street Crossing in Mt Union  
 Ward to be paid out of the Street Crossing fund  
 of said Ward. Second by Betts And Carried  
 Yeas Pennoek Betts Bush Jones Johnson Miller Seft  
 Vick Williams - Yeas None Nays None.

### Second Reading

An Ordinance Entitled An Ordinance to Authorize the Mayor and Clerk of City Alliance Ohio to issue the Bonds of said City for the purpose of Extending the time of payment of the Bonded debt due Feb 1st 1889.

Mr Johnson moved to suspend the rules requiring Ordinances to be read on three different days, that the Ordinance may be read the third time, and put on final passage. Seconded by Mr Betts and Carried by the following vote Yeas Pennock, Betts, Bush, Jones, Johnson, Miller, Seft, Dick, Volkanos, Yeas 9 Nays None. <sup>The Ordinance was read the third time</sup> A vote was then taken on the final passage of the Ordinance, with the same result, Yeas 9 Nays None. President Pennock declared the Ordinance duly passed.

Mr Smith asked the permission of Council to erect a pair of Platform Scales on the north side of Grant Street near the crossing of the Lake Alliance Lake Erie & Southern R. R. On Motion Request was granted, on Conditions that the Beam Box be located within the property line.

On Motion the Street Commissioner was instructed to repair Culvert on Broad way (also to repair a portion of Street between Broadway & Cambridge Streets)

Preambles And Resolutions of the Alliance City Council - Submitted And read as follows:

Whereas, during the years of 1886<sup>and</sup> 1887 our successive town Councils, by the pressing needs of a fast growing community, were led to issue orders on the town Treasury in Anticipation of taxes uncollected until, at the time of the organization of our present city Government in April last, all the municipal funds collected for that year had been exhausted, with unpaid orders & claims against the Corporation remaining of over \$6000.00

And Whereas, The Present City Council was thus left to the embarrassing task of organizing & putting into operation the Machinery of a new City government, to meet all the urgent Public needs of a fast growing and flourishing young City full of new and live enterprises with no money in its Treasury and very little to anticipate for the year;

And Whereas,

Being thus situated, with the state Legislature not in session, and seemingly no legal means for immediate relief accessible, to avoid a greater evil, and at the earnest solicitation of leading citizens and tax payers, the Council was very unwillingly led to issue numerous treasury orders in anticipation of future provisions for their payment, in order to meet the most pressing Public needs through the summer and Autumn months.

Now therefore be it Resolved By the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio, that we, at this the earliest practicable time, for the relief of our Citizens holding unpaid orders and claims, <sup>and</sup> for the good Faith and Credit of our City, proceed to carry out our constant intention to seek such means as will enable us legally to fund all the floating indebtedness of our City up to this time, leaving all the municipal funds from taxes levied for this year to meet the wants of the same, as they are intended to do.

Resolved

That for this purpose The Finance Committee of this Council be, <sup>and</sup> the same are, hereby instructed <sup>and</sup> empowered, to immediately proceed to institute such measures as may by them be deemed best and necessary to procure the passage of an Act by our State Legislature now in session, authorizing us to provide by ordinance for the taking up <sup>and</sup> paying off all the present floating debt of our city with funds to be realized from the sale of the Bonds of the city in such amount as may be necessary payable at such intervals and running such time as will render their payment prompt and easy to our citizens, and leave our finances in such shape that there will be no need nor excuse for future delinquencies of this kind.

### An Ordinance

To appropriate money in the Treasury to pay  
 certain Claims therein described

Read as follows

Section 1<sup>st</sup> Be it Ordained and enacted by the Council  
 of the City of Alliance O. that there be and there is  
 hereby appropriated from any money in the  
 general fund of Treasury not otherwise appro-  
 priated the sum of nine hundred dollars

dollars (\$900. to pay Expenses incurred in the late Saloon trials, and the Clerk is hereby Authorized to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same in favor of A Betts on the presentation of Proper Vouchers. Passed Jan 21 1889 Mel Pennock President

Preambles And resolutions of Alliance City Council. Read as follows

Whereas Through An Oversight of dates, this council has failed to provide for the reissue of Bonds in time to take up the Funding Bonds of Alliance. falling due February 1<sup>st</sup> 1889 And Whereas

Said Bonds to the amount of Fifteen Thousand Dollars are held by the Society for savings in the city of Cleveland, Ohio, which through its treasurer Myron S. Herrick has kindly consented to carry the same until they can be lifted by the sale of new Bonds.

Now therefore <sup>be it</sup> resolved by this council that the time of payment of the refunding Bonds of Alliance, Ohio due February 1<sup>st</sup> 1889 and numbered from 529 to 543 inclusive with the Coupons thereof attached and now held by the Society for Savings before named be and the same is hereby extended to such time as Council may be prepared to take them up by the sale of new refunding Bonds of the city and also that said Bonds and Coupons so extended shall bear interest from maturity to date of payment at the rate of six per cent per annum payable semiannually. February and August. Done in Council Chamber this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1889.
