

Council Chamber Alliance O April 10th 1889

Council Met pursuant to Adjournment

Johnson Moved that there be apportioned to the General fund from the unapportioned funds in the hands of the Treasurer the sum of \$265⁰⁰, Secured by Bush and Carried

Bush Moved that a Special Committee of three in conjunction with the Civil Engineer be appointed to establish the lines and grade on College Street in Mount Union Co. Secured by Betts and Carried
Mr Johnson Bush and Miller were appointed said Committee.

Johnson Moved that a Special Committee of three, consisting of Williams Vick and Pennock be appointed to take act in the matter of Change of grade on South Arch Street.

Mr Johnson Chairman of the finance Committee reported the Approval of the following Additional Bills and asked the same be included in Bills Ordinance before the passage.
