



Buildings and Grounds

Moved by Johnson and seconded  
by Bush. That President Pennock be added  
to the finance committee. Carried  
A list of one hundred and forty four names  
of citizens suitable to serve as jurors was  
then read and on motion of Johnson seconded  
by Betts the same was accepted.

Moved by Betts and seconded by Hull that  
the regular meetings of this Council be held  
on the first and third Mondays of each month  
and that the Solicitor be instructed to  
prepare an ordinance in accordance therewith  
Carried. Moved by Betts seconded by  
Johnson that the street committee report  
at next meeting some plan by which  
Poll Tax might be collected. Carried

Betts then read the following Ordinance

An Ordinance to provide for the enforcement of  
The Prohibitory Ordinance

Be it ordained and enacted by the  
City Council of Alliance, Ohio. That the  
President of this Council shall appoint a committee  
of three of its members who are instructed to  
employ any assistance they deem necessary  
to ascertain whether there are violations of the  
Prohibitory Ordinance and to procure  
evidence to convict any such violators

Sec 2<sup>nd</sup>

That of the funds collected from  
Saloon keepers the sum of one thousand  
dollars be allowed to remain in the City  
Treasury unappropriated for the purposes of  
defraying the expense of prosecuting violators  
of the Prohibitory Ordinance.

This ordinance shall take effect on and  
after its passage

President. Pennock declared the motion carried and appointed Betts, Bush and Johnson as the committee provided for in the ordinance.

Sefer stated that parties on Webb Street desired the grade that they might lay sidewalks. And on motion of Johnson seconded by Sefer. The street committee was instructed to attend to the matter at once.

The clerk was instructed to notify Nicholson & Co. Contractors that Arch Street was in condition for them to resume work.

Moved by Johnson Sec. by Bush that the marshal notify Market Street Property owners of passage by council of paving resolution. Carried.

There being no further business Council adjourned.
