

Council Chamber Alliance 6 May 6 1889
 Council met in regular session with Vice
 President J. H. Still in the Chair. Members
 all present except Remock. Minutes of
 Preceding meeting read and approved.
 Communications &c

Wm Brinker tendered his resignation as
 member of Board of Equalization on motion of
 Johnson seconded by Siefert. The same was
 accepted. A communication from W Trail
 in regard to account of Jno Mc Gregor was
 read. Johnson stating that the matter would
 receive attention. The following bids for
 Street Lighting was then presented.

To the Mayor and Council of the City of
 Alliance. Gentlemen. In accordance
 with your advertisement for proposals for Electric
 Street Lighting. We will erect a system covering
 the streets named and suspend lamps across streets
 or on poles as you may direct at the following prices
 For 12 o'clock ^{lights} to be lighted as many
 or as few nights as you please for the sum of
 Seventeen & one half cents per lamp each and
 for all night lamps thirty five cents each

 our propositions for the city lighting by two
 thousand (2000) candle power arc lamps
 1st Thompson-Houston system as follows

Bid for Lamps to burn all night from
 dark until daylight each night during the year
 for seven dollars (\$7⁰⁰) per lamp per month
 2nd all lights to burn from dark until
 midnight each night during the year for
 six dollars (\$6⁰⁰) per lamp per month

The remaining forty one (41) lights to burn from dark to midnight as follows
Main Street Light Seven Dollars (\$7.00) per light the remaining lights at Six Dollars per light Per month

H.H. Main Street lights to burn all night during the year and the balance to burn to midnight twenty nights in each month as follows Seven Dollars (\$7.00) Per lamp per month for Main Street lights and Five Dollars (\$5.00) Per month for the remaining lights.

He will furnish the six (6) lights for Mt Union Ward on the same terms as bids for the city lighting

These bids are for one two or three years as the Council may elect

He also agrees to wire up the city in a neat and substantial manner running the main lines through the alleys of said city if so desired thereby avoiding the disfiguring of your streets by poles and to install the plant within eight weeks or less if so desired and to light Main Street immediately

The lights to be placed in the center of the street or on poles as the Council may direct

On motion of Betts seconded by Brinker the above bids were referred to the Lighting and Finance Committees.

E.H. Brusius then read a petition from citizens protesting against the vacation of the Rockhill road unless another passage way was opened farther east.

on motion of Johnson seconded by Betts the matter was referred to street committee to report at next meeting.

The Finance Committee then reported the approval of a number of bills and on motion of Betts seconded by Brinker

The Solicitor was instructed to prepare an ordinance to provide for the payment of same.

In regard to Resolution for grading south Arch Street Craine moved that it be referred to Grade Committee seconded by Johnson and Carried.

On Motion of Craine seconded by Bush the report of Police Committee was taken from the table. Craine moved that first proposition which read as follows be adopted.

That this Council employ for the coming year two Policemen for full time and one policeman to be a resident of Mt Union ward for half time to be principally spent in Mt Union ward but subject to serve in any other ward on the call of the Mayor or Chief of Police. Seconded by Brinker and carried.

Craine then moved that second proposition which read as follows be adopted.

The Policemen shall be employed for the coming year reserving the right in the Council to discharge ^{them} at any time and for any reason the Council may see fit and from the time of said discharge the said Policemen shall receive no pay. The Contract employing said Policemen shall be reduced to writing and signed by both parties.

Seconded by Hartzell and carried.

Craine then moved the adoption of Third proposition as follows. That the city furnish the two Policemen on full time each with a blue double breasted Prince Albert coat and helmet but said coats and hats to be at all times the property of the city. The yeas & nays were called and resulted as follows. Yeas Hull, Hartzell, Brinker, Craine. Nays Betts, Bush, Early, Sefer, Miller, Johnson and Crubaugh. Yeas four Nays seven. The motion was declared lost.

Mayor Chapman presented the name of Geo. R. Gyger for city civil engineer and an motion of Craine seconded by Betts. Mr Gyger was confirmed. The Mayor then presented the names of Wm Hindermonth of 4th ward & Lamott of 5th ward. and Chas Buttrolph of 6th ward to be members of Board of Health

Moved by Brinker see by Johnson that the same be confirmed. Carried

Mayor Chapman then read Law in regard to the appointment of fire Marshals. and an motion of Craine see by Brinker the same was referred to fire Committee.

An Ordinance entitled an Ordinance to fix the time of the regular meetings of the council. Was read second time

An Ordinance entitled An Ordinance to provide for the grading and improvement of Union Avenue between Main Street and State Street in the city of Alliance

Ohio. Was read and on motion of Craine ~~second~~ second by ~~Brinker~~ ^{Betts} the rules were suspended and same passed second reading.

Moved by Betts and seconded by Brinker that the rules be suspended and the Ordinance placed on its final passage. Carried The Ordinance was then read. and the yeas and nays called. Which resulted as follows. Yeas. Betts. Bush. Siefert. Miller Hull Hartzell. Johnson. Brinker Craine Cumbargh. Nays. Earley. Yeas 10 nays 1 Ordinance declared duly passed.

Craine moved that J. B. Scott be appointed Member of Board of Equalization ~~6th~~ sec by Cumbargh. The yeas & nays being called. resulted in the yeas eleven nays none. on motion of Betts seconded by Earley. Hiram Hartzell was duly appointed member of board from 1st ward. yeas 11 nays 0

Moved by Johnson seconded by Brinker that Wm. F. Galbreath be appointed to fill the unexpired term of Mrs Brinker resigned yeas & nays called. yeas 11 nays 0.

Moved by Bush sec by Craine that the resolution to improve arch Street from Summit Street to Wilmer Street be taken from the table carried
