

Council Chamber Alliance 8 May 27 / 189

Council met in special session upon call of The Mayor for the purpose of Legislation for the improvement of Union Avenue and Arch and Liberty streets and to consider other matters of interest-

President H. C. Penrock in the chair and the following Members present, Bush, Sefton, Miller, Hull, Johnson Brinker, Craine and Lerubough. Absent Betts, Early, Hartzler.

Clerk read report of Marshal of having served notice to property owners on Liberty Street of passage by council of resolution for improving said street. President Penrock read communication from A. B. Star in regard to Union Ave bridge.

Report of street committee

The City Engineer reported that the proposed improvement of Union Avenue would cost 9700 Per foot front according to the plans and specifications.

Brinker moved that the Clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for the above improvement seconded by Johnson. The yeas and nays being called resulted as follows

Yeas. Bush, Sefton, Miller, Hull, Johnson, Brinker, Craine, Lerubough, Penrock
Yeas (9) nays none. Motion declared carried.

Ordinances

An Ordinance entitled. An Ordinance to improve Liberty Street ~~South~~ from Main Street south to Summit Street was called up and for second reading and an motion of Bush second by Johnson the Ordinance was read second time by its title.

Bush moved the rules be suspended and the ordinance ~~be~~ read third time second by Brinker. The yeas and nays being called resulted yeas 9 nays none.

A vote was then taken on the final passage of the ordinance resulting as follows yeas Bush, Sefton, Miller, Hull, Johnson, Brinker, Craine, Lerubough, Penrock. Pres. Penrock declared the ordinance duly passed.

Bush then moved that J. R. Morgan be appointed and John H. Miller be appointed to act with the engineer as a committee to oversee the improvement of Liberty Street on Liberty st seconded by Johnson and carried

Moved by Bush that the engineer be instructed to prepare plans and specifications for the improvement of Liberty Street see by Hull and carried.

an Motion of Bush seconded by Hull Thomas Benington be permitted to proceed with the grading of south arch street without contract. carried

Craine moved that D D Waugh and J. H. Stanley be appointed to act with engineer to superintend the grading of South Arch Street seconded by Bush and carried.

Brinker moved that the engineer be instructed to employ suitable person to assist in overseeing Arch Street paving. seconded by Defert. The yeas and nays being called resulted yeas Defert Hull Brinker. Craine. Nays Bush, Miller Johnson Crumbach and Punnock

Yeas 41 nays (5) Motion declared lost Johnson of the finance committee then made the following report of Tax Levy for 1889.

Johnson moved the solicitor be instructed to draw an ordinance for tax levy in accordance with above reports seconded by Hull and carried

Bids for electric lighting was then read as follows.

To the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance O. The Alliance Street railway co will furnish material and light the city for Seven Dollars (\$7⁰⁰) per month. Lights to burn from dark until daylight - twenty nights in each month.

The Alliance Street-Railway Co.

To the Mayor and Council of the City of Alliance O

This company hereby bid on Main Street electric lights and those that may be ordered north of Main Street at thirty five cts (35) per lamp each same to be used as few or as many as the Mayor or other competent authority may direct. We decline making any proposition for any lights south of Main St
Mutual Electric Light-Co.

Johnson moved that the above bids be referred to the Lighting Committee with instructions to report at once see by Brinker and Carried

The Committee then made the following report. The Joint Committee on Public Lights by leave to report in favor of the rejection of all bids to date for the lighting of the city by electric lights. ^{Brinker & Defert} on motion of Hull see by Brinker the report was accepted.

Bush then offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. Be it resolved that it is the sense of this Council that all Electric Lights that are now in use for the purpose of Public Lighting and paid for by the city shall be discontinued from this date. Seconded by Defert. Hull moved that the resolution be allowed to lay on the table until next meeting. Seconded by Craine and Carried.

No further business Council adjourned
