

Council Chamber Minutes of June 17, 1889

Council met in regular session with President W. C. Penrock in the Chair. Members present, Betts, Bush, Miller, Hull, Hartzell, Johnson, Brinker, Crumbaugh. Absent, Carey, Sefert, Craun. Minutes read and approved.

A Petition of property owners on Fulton Street asking for sidewalk on south side of said street was read, and on motion of Bush seconded by Hull the same was referred to the sidewalk committee.

A Communication from L. E. Hartzell asking for the vacation of all streets and alleys in Highland Park addition, south of Island Avenue in said addition was read and on motion of Johnson the same was referred to the Street Committee.

Communication from J. C. Craun asking the privilege of placing his scales over the gutter in front of his warehouse was read, moved by Brinker and seconded by Bush that the privilege be granted. Carried.

A Petition of property owners on Rich Street from Summit Street South to Wilson, asking that Council enter into contract ^{with} Michaelson & Co for the paving said street, was read.

Betts moved the same be referred to Judiciary Committee. Seconded by Miller and Lost, no further action being taken upon the Petition.

A Petition, asking for the vacation of the Rockhill Road, from the north boundary of the Pennsylvania Company's property and right of way to the south side thereof and signed by Edgar Shimp agent for said company, J. H. Purthe, E. E. Scranton, S. Shimp, M. H. Cantine and R. B. Dawsell was read. Hull moved that the petition be accepted and placed on file and that the Clerk be instructed to have published in one of the weekly city papers for

The following Ordinance was read.

Be it ordained by the city Council of Alliance Ohio that of the money now in the hands of the city Treasurer unapportioned, \$200⁰⁰ be apportioned to the General fund, \$390⁰⁰ to the Gas fund, \$140⁰⁰ to the Street and Sanitary fund, to the fire fund \$50⁰⁰ to the prison fund \$20⁰⁰ to the Police and Salary fund, \$200⁰⁰.

On Motion of Bush the same was placed on its Passage. The yeas and nays being called resulted Yeas 8, Nays 0, and the ordinance was declared

duly passed. There not being sufficient money ~~in~~ ⁱⁿ certain funds to pay many bills Johnson, Moved that of the unapportioned funds in the treasury, \$50⁰⁰ be Apportioned to the Street and Sanitary fund, \$41⁰⁰ to the Police and Salary fund. Sec by yeas and carried. The Claims Ordinance for the payment of bills for the month of May was read as follows
