Communications from different parties in regard to the quality of their brick was read President Pennock at this time retired and Vice President Hull occupied the Chair.

The Finance Committee reported favorably on a number of bills for the month of June. Carley asked for a separate vote on bill of W.D. Martin for \$500.00

Brinker moved the bills as read be accepted and the Solicitor be instructed to prepare an ordinance for their payment

Seconded by Betts & Carried.

An Ordinance Entitled "An Ordinance to appropriate money for the payment of a certain Claim against the City" Providing for the payment of the bill of H. D. Martin for \$500⁰⁰ for Detective services in Liqueur cases was then read.

Moved by Betts and seconded by Johnson it be placed on its passage. The yeas and nays were called resulting, Yeas Betts, Bush, Johnson, Brinker, Hull. Nays Earley, Defert, Miller and Hartzell. ~~and the yeas 5.~~ Nays 4 and the ordinance was declared lost.

The Street Committee to whom was referred the petition asking for the opening of a street from Union Avenue west to the Corporation line along the south side of Johnson property reported favorably on the same and on motion of Johnson report accepted.

The report of the committee on the improvement of Union Avenue, was read as follows:

To the City Council, Gentlemen we your committee appointed to investigate the various bids for Grading, Draining, and Macadamizing Union Avenue from Main Street to Main Street in Mt Union. Respectfully recommend the acceptance of M. McCauley's bid of thirty cents per cubic yard for Excavation. Three cents per lineal foot for four inch tile and Eighty five cents per cubic yard for Macadamizing with furnace slag.

Engineer Gyger submitted plans and Specifications for the improvement of Market Street. Moved by Brinker and seconded

by Johnson that they be so amended as to require a certified check of \$500.00 to accompany each bid as a guarantee of good faith. Carried. Brinker moved specifications as amended be adopted. sec by

Betts and carried. Moved by Johnson and seconded by Brinker. That Committee on printing have the specifications printed and the Clerk be instructed to advertize for bids. Carried on motion of Brinker the Engineer was instructed to set grade stakes on Union Avenue. The Committee to whom was referred the nuisance on G. H. Lunk's property reported the same unabated and on Motion of Busk seconded by Brinker the Solicitor was instructed to draw a resolution for the abatement of the same. in accordance with the statutes.

Betts moved that the Clerk be instructed to notify the Alliance St Railway Co to discontinue the practice of allowing advertising matter to be posted on the sides of street cars. Sec by Early & Carried

The Engineer then reported the amount of dirt to be moved contained in the contract with Thomas Birmingham on the south Arch street grading to be 4800 cubic yards.

Brinker moved that the report of the Committee on South Arch street grading be taken from the table. seconded by Busk & Carried

Brinker then moved the adoption of the first clause of the Committee report which read as follows. That the amount of money necessary to pay the present contractor Thos Bewington for all work actually done by himself in grading and street should be assessed on all property between Summit and State Street excepting the 2% as is otherwise provided by Statute. Seconded by Bush and Carried.

The ^{South} West Street Assessing Ordinance was then read third time, and on motion of Brinker seconded by Betts was placed on its final Passage. The yeas & Nays being called resulted. Yeas Betts, Bush, Lieut. Miller, Hull, Hartzell, Johnson, Brinker, Yeas 8 Nays 0.

A Resolution to abate nuisance was read as follows: Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that the stagnant water collected and collected and standing on lot No 652 in Peters Lamborn & Co's addition to the city of Alliance, belonging to George Washington Funk is detrimental to the public health and comfort and is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and the owner of said lot George Washington Funk is hereby notified to abate said nuisance within three days after receiving a copy of this resolution by thoroughly draining said lot or by filling said lot so as to prevent water standing thereon and if he fails to comply with the notice within the time stated the city will abate said nuisance at his expense.

Be it further resolved that the Marshal be instructed to serve a copy of this resolution on George Washington Funk and to make due return thereof to this Council."

Moved by Brinker and seconded by Defert that the Resolution as read be adopted. The yeas and Nays were called resulting Yeas, Betts, Bush, Defert, Miller, Hull, Hartzell, Johnson, Brinker and the Motion was declared carried.
