

Council Chamber. Alliance 0 July 15 1889

Council met in regular session with vice president Hull in the Chair. The roll was called and the following members present. Betts Bush Defert Miller Hull Hartzell Johnson. Brinker

Craine Lombard. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved. a communication from Melvin Clay do inviting Council to visit their works and inspect brick in view of the brick to be used on Liberty street was read. and on motion of Johnson the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Return of Notice by Marshal to 8th Street to abate nuisance was called for. and reported as having been served. as required by resolution.

An ordinance an entitled. An Ordinance to amend grade on Oxford Street; called up. and Brinker moved the rules be suspended and ordinance be read second time by title seconded by Defert. and carried. by the following vote. Yeas Betts Bush Defert Miller. Hull, Johnson Brinker Craine Lombard Hartzell. Yeas 10. Nays 0. The ordinance was then read by title. Moved by Brinker see by Bush. the rules be suspended and ordinance be read third time and placed on its final passage. Carried. Yeas Betts, Bush, Defert, Miller Hull Hartzell Johnson Brinker. Craine Lombard. Yeas 10 Nays 0.

Vote was then taken on final passage of the ordinance resulting Yeas Betts, Bush, Defert, Miller Hull, Hartzell, Johnson, Brinker, Craine, Lombard. Yeas 10 Nays 0. and the ordinance was declared duly passed. President Pennock arrived at this time and occupied the Chair.

There not being sufficient funds in several of the different funds for the payment of the June bills. Johnson moved that. there be apportioned from the unapportioned fund. to the General fund \$8⁰³ to the Street and Sanitary fund. \$5³ $\frac{46}{100}$

to the Police and Salary fund \$84 65
 seconded by Brinker and carried.

Report of Street Committee

Brinker reported. That sewer in Alley
 east of Mechanic Street had been
 repaired. and also called attention of
 Council. to the water coming down Arch
 Street. and overflowing Main Street.

And on motion of Bush. the same was
 referred to the engineer. to report - Means
 of relieving same.

Resolution

The following resolution was then read
 Resolved that it is the sense of this Council that
 the practice of our Merchants using the sidewalks
 for the purpose of storing Boxes. Barrels and
 other material in violation of an Ordinance
 regulating the same thereby obstructing Public
 Travel is a nuisance and that the Mayor
 and City Marshal be requested to have such
 obstructions removed at once.

Moved by Betts Brinker and seconded by Betts
 the same be adopted. Carried. by the
 following vote Yeas. Betts Siefert Miller
 Hull. Johnson Brinker Braine Lombard
 Pennock. Nays. Bush. Hartzell.

Yeas 9 Nays 2.

The Solicitor reported a mistake in the Arch
 Street assessing Ordinance. and read
 an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to
 Amend Sec 1 of an Ordinance entitled -
 An Ordinance to assess a special tax on
 the real estate remaining and abutting on
 Arch Street south to State Street and to
 issue bonds in anticipation of the
 collection of such assessments."

Moved by Johnson the rules be suspended
 and the ordinance read second time by
 title see by Hartzell and carried. by the following
 vote. Yeas. Betts Bush Siefert Miller Hull
 Hartzell Johnson Brinker Braine
 Lombard Pennock. Yeas 11 Nays 0

The ordinance was read second time by title.

Moved by Betts and seconded by Bush
the ordinance be read third time and placed
on final passage. Carried. Yeas Betts Bush
Sefert Miller Hull Hartzell Johnson Brinker
Graine Crubanks. Penrock. Yeas 11 Nays 0

The ordinance was then read third time
and the vote taken on the final passage.
resulting yeas Betts Bush Sefert Miller
Hull. Hartzell. Johnson Brinker Graine
Crubanks. Penrock. Yeas 11 Nays 0 and
the ordinance was declared duly passed.

The attention of Council was
called to the condition of culvert-across
Broadway near the reservoir. and on
motion of Johnson was referred to ~~the~~ street
committee with power to act.

Sefert reported complaints being
made in regard to Bulletin board on Liberty
Street opposite Arlington Hotel. and moved
the Marshal be instructed to have the same
removed. Seconded by Brinker and carried
Grade Committee

Miller reported having met County Commissioners
and that they would do nothing toward
repairing culvert-across sewer. Near Standup
Mill.

Specifications for the
improvement of Broadway were read by
engineer. and on motion of Bush seconded
by Hartzell they were amended as to read
Eight-inch tile instead of four inch tile.

and on motion of Johnson they were
further amended as to require a certified check
of \$100⁰⁰ to accompany each bid instead
\$500⁰⁰

Bush moved the specifications
as amended be adopted and the Clerk be
instructed to advertise for bids. in accordance
with the same seconded by Brinker
and carried. Johnson moved that
Mr McAuley to whom was awarded the
contract of improving Union Ave be

permitted to commence work at once
seconded by Hartzell and carried.

Bush Moved That Davis
and Caldwell. be permitted to commence
work at once on Liberty Street, seconded
by Hartzell and carried.

Property
owners on
Lombard Ave
to give
bond.

President Pennock stated That Property
owners on South Arch Street, whose property
would not bear the proposed improvement
were willing to indemnify the city against
any extra cost in said improvement by
giving bonds for cost of same.

Moved by Hartzell and seconded by Miller
Bonds be accepted. Carried

On Motion. Bush called attention
to condition of pavement on Main Street
relaid by Street Railway Co. and offered
~~following resolution~~. Moved That the Clerk
be instructed to notify said company to proceed
at once to put the same in proper shape in
accordance with their franchise. Seconded by
Betts and Carried

Attention was called to citizens of first
ward wanting water privileges and on
motion of Brinker was referred to the
water committee.

Betts reported bad condition of
sidewalk on Hester Avenue. Hartzell Moved
That the sidewalk committee confer with
Township trustees and County Commissioners
in regard to the matter. Seconded by
Johnson & carried

Mayor Chapman reported
that the bonds of John Madden for his
appearance in Mayor's Court and the bond
of John Bissler for payment of fine had
been declared forfeited and on motion of

Betts seconded by Johnson the
Solicitor was instructed to proceed at once
to collect amount of such bonds.

Sidewalk resolutions were then read as follows
 Be it resolved by the council of the city of Alliance O
 that the owner of lots no 53 and 54 in Millers 3^d
 addition to the city of Alliance O be and is now hereby required
 and ordered within 30 days after legal notice to him of the
 passage of this resolution to construct a sidewalk on west-end
 of lots no 53 and 54 in the addition aforesaid upon the
 elevation fixed by the ordinance now in force providing and
 establishing a grade on Linden Ave street in said city
 That said sidewalk shall be six feet wide and
 constructed of stone or brick.

Moved by Brinker the above resolution be amended
 as to read flag stone or brick. see by Johnson
 and carried. Moved by Hartzell seconded by
 Brinker the same be adopted. Carried.

Sidewalk resolution no 2

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Alliance
 Ohio that the owner of lot no 52 in Millers 3^d addition
 to the city of Alliance O be and is now hereby required
 and ordered within 30 Days after legal notice to him
 of the passage of this resolution to construct a sidewalk
 on west-end of lot no 52 in the addition aforesaid
 upon the elevation fixed by the ordinance now in
 force providing and establishing a grade on Linden
 Avenue in said city. That said sidewalk shall be
 six feet wide and constructed of flag stone or
 Brick.

On Motion of Hartzell seconded
 by Brinker the resolution was adopted by
 the following vote. Betts Bush Defert Miller
 Hull Hartzell Johnson Brinker Crubaugh
 Penrock Yes 10 days 0.

Moved by Bush that when we adjourn it be
 to meet Monday evening July 22. seconded
 by Hartzell and carried.

Hartzell. Moved that street committees have dirt
 from the excavation of Union Ave used to bring
 sidewalks on South side of Main Street
 along the Coates properties to grade.
 seconded by Miller & carried

On Motion of Miller seconded by Belts
The Street Committee were instructed to have
catch Basins built at that point.

The Claims Ordinance providing for
the payment of June bills ~~was~~ was then
read as follows.
