Council Chamber Alliance 1 Sept 2 1889

Council met in regular session with President Pennock in the chair and the following members present. Bush Early Supt. Miller Hull Hartzell Johnson Brinker Craige Crutcher Absent. Betts. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

The Mayor's report for the month of August showing \$224 $\frac{84}{100}$ collected for fines and licenses was read and on motion of Johnson was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication from T. R. Morgan Sr asking that Chas Bush act in his place on the citizens committee on the Broadway improvement was read.

The following waiver of Street Railway Co was then read.

To the President and gentlemen of the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio
We have received your notice of the proposed improvement of Arch Street between Summit and Milner Streets by placing said section of said Street to grade paving the road bed with fire brick &c and instructing us within thirty days to pave between the rails of our road according to the specifications of said improvement on file in the office of the City Clerk. We hereby request

The council of the city of Alliance to permit the contractor for the city to do the entire work of said improvement, including the grading, filling and paving between the rails of our road for which work between our rails we agree to pay to the city at such time or times as required of us by a special assessing ordinance.

And we further more consent to an assessment upon our property for the cost and expense of paving between our rails to the same extent and with the same virtue and effect in law as if we were in default at the expiration of the said thirty days notice.

Know All Men by these presents, that in consideration of the City of Alliance Ohio the Obligee herein permitting the use of paving brick made by the "Malvern Clay Company" the obligor herein on the Liberty Street improvement now being made on said Liberty Street from Mari Street South to Summit Street in the City of Alliance Stark Co Ohio. We the Malvern Clay Co. by J N. Wilson President and Chas J. Dresiman Secretary, as principals and as Sureties are held and firmly bound unto the City of Alliance aforesaid in the sum of Five Thousand (\$5000) Dollars for the payment of which well and truly to be made we do hereby bind ourselves. Signed this 31st day of August 1889. The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the Malvern Clay Co. have guaranteed and do hereby guarantee to the City of Alliance aforesaid the fine clay paving brick delivered by it to the Contractor of the Liberty Street improvement in said City of Alliance and used by the Contractor in the paving of said Liberty

from Main Street South to ~~East~~ Summit Street to be first class fire clay paving brick and the said Malvern Clay Co does hereby agree to indemnify the said City of Alliance against any and all loss arising from the use of said brick for a period of five years from and after the completion of said improvement. And for the same period of five years the said Company agrees to replace from time to time at its own expense and without unnecessary delay all brick injured in said pavement as the result of traffic or weather and to keep and have the brick used in said pavement natural wear and tear alone excepted as good at the end of the said period of five years as at the beginning.

Now if the said Malvern Clay Co shall faithfully perform and do the several matters and things above mentioned during the period aforesaid then the obligation shall be void. Otherwise it shall be and remain in full force and virtue in law.
