

Council Chamber Alliance O Oct 7 1889  
 Council met in regular session with president  
 Pennek presiding and the following  
 members present. Betts Bush. Carley. Sefert  
 Miller ~~State~~ Hartzell Johnson Brinker  
 Braine Crubough. Absent. Hull and Miller  
 The minutes of the preceding meetings were  
 read and approved.

Hartzell moved that when council adjourn  
 it be to meet Monday evening Oct 14<sup>th</sup>.

On motion of Johnson seconded by Braine  
 the sum of two hundred and forty seven & <sup>20</sup>/<sub>100</sub>  
 was appropriated to the Street and Sanitary  
 fund from the unapportioned funds in the  
 city treasury. On motion of Braine seconded  
 by Betts the clerk was instructed to notify  
 the street commissioner to itemize his bills.

The Claims Ordinance providing  
 for the payment of bills against the city  
 for the month of August was then read  
 as follows. An Ordinance  
 To appropriate money in the city treasury to  
 pay the claims hereto described:

Bruiken Braine Crubough Penrock  
Nays Earley Hartzell. Yeas 8 nays 2  
and President Penrock declared the  
ordinance passed.

Craine moved that the solicitor be instructed to prepare an ordinance appropriating a strip ~~of land fifty feet wide~~. The right of way fifty feet wide commencing at a point on Union Avenue between the lands of and and running west to the Corporation line for a public street, seconded by Johnson and carried.

An Ordinance

Entitled "An Ordinance to establish a grade on North Freedom Street" was read first time

Moved by Betts and seconded by Siefert that the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read second time by title. The yeas and nays were called resulting.
