

Alliance O. Oct 21 1854

Council met in regular session with president Penrock presiding and the following members present: Betts Bush Miller Hull Johnson Brinker Coaine Crutauy. Absent: Startzell Seft-Earley. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

A number of bills for the month of September having been referred to different committees having been approved were read and ordered embodied in the September Claims ordinance.

On motion of Coaine the Engineer was instructed to give Rev Toland of sixth ward the grade. Moved by Coaine see by

Brinker the Engineer was instructed to assist the Clerk in preparing the necessary assessments to be returned to the Auditor along the line of the streets now being improved.

Moved by Johnson that A C Silver be appointed Cemetery director to fill the unexpired term of Joseph Graham deceased. Carried Yes Betts Bush Miller Hull Johnson Brinker Coaine Crutauy Penrock Yes 9 nays none

The question of places for holding the coming election in the different wards was brought up and on motions it was agreed that the election in first ward at the McDougan building. Near Scamler's Grocery. in the second ward at the Ammerman building. corner Nett and Patterson streets. Third ward at Morris' Store fourth ward at town Hall. fifth ward at Jas Clark's residence. Mechanic street in sixth ward at sixth ward town Hall.

Moved by Hull the Rockhill road ordinance be taken from the table and be placed on its passage. The ordinance was read third time and vote taken on the final passage resulting yeas Betts Bush Hull Miller Johnson Brinker Craine Crubungh Pennock yeas 9 nays none and the ordinance was declared duly passed.

Moved by Bush seconded by Brinker that when we adjourn it be until Monday evening Oct 28. Carried.

There not being sufficient money in some of the funds to pay the September bills Johnson moved there be appropriated from the unappropriated moneys in the treasury to the Street and Sanitary fund the sum of \$400<sup>00</sup> and to the Police and Salary

fund \$40<sup>00</sup> secured by grain and carrier

The bill of the Alliance Water works as for  
\$968<sup>00</sup> being due was read and on motion  
of Johnson the same was accepted.

Bush offered a resolution declaring  
it to be the sense of the Council that the  
bid of the Electric Alliance Street Railway Co  
for lighting the city with electricity be accepted  
and that said company be given the contract  
for furnishing 30 electric lights at \$6<sup>00</sup> per  
lamp per month. Sec'd and moved the  
adoption of the same. Seconded by Betts  
and lost Yeas Betts Bush Miller Nays  
Hull Johnson Brinker Crutcher Pennock  
Yeas 3 nays 5. Bush then moved that the resolution  
to discontinue all electric lights be taken  
from the table. seconded by Betts. and lost  
No further business
