

Council Chamber Alliance of Jan 20/1890

Council met in regular session with president Penrock in the chair and the following members present. Bush. Earley. Miller Hull. Hartzell Brinker Craine.

On Motion of Hull. The reading of The minutes was dispensed with.

Craine moved that the Mayor appoint - suitable person to act with Auditor and Recorder to make a revision of the numbers of all inlots and outlots in the city according to ~~the~~ sections 2615 and 2616. Revised Statutes of Ohio and the city to pay all costs exceeding \$125⁰⁰. Seconded by Hull and lost. Yeas 4 Hull Hartzell Brinker Craine ~~Penrock~~

Nays. Bush Barley Miller. Yeas 5 Nays 3

Moved by Brinker that the light-committee be instructed to enter into contract with Electric lighting companies for lighting the city twenty nights per month. seconded by Hartzell and lost. Yeas ~~Penrock~~

Earley Miller Hartzell Brinker Penrock Nays. Bush Hull Craine. Yeas (5) Nays (3)

Craine called attention of council to defective catch basins on Union Avenue and water overflowing the street and damaging the same. and on motion the same was referred to the street-committee.

The ^{Engineer} Committee to whom was referred. The matter of calculating the amount due for which the Alliance Street Rail way co is liable for the paving of Arch Street made the following report.

Paving $2575 \times 5 = 1397.22$ sq yds @ 93c 1299.41
Under Nicholson contract Total \$1749.68

According to the estimate of the city engineer there was yet due M Macaulay on the Union Avenue Improvement contract the sum of \$3171.76 and Brinker moved that the amount be included in the claims ordinance for payment seconded by Miller and carried

Attention was called to the condition of the belfry and spouting on the city Hall and on motion of Craine the same was referred

to the committee on buildings and grounds.

There not being sufficient money in certain funds to pay the amounts drawn in the claims ordinance presented.

Craine moved that there be appropriated from the unappropriated fund to the general fund the sum of \$245.30 and to the Police and Salary fund \$76.00. Seconded by Brinker and Carried.

The Claims Ordinance providing for the payment of certain claims, was then read as follows.

G. H. Frank having called the attention of council to the water from Linden because overflowing and damaging his property. The same was on motion of Bush referred to the street committee with power to act. No further business
