The following resolution was unanimously adopted by the Board of Trade Jan 28th 1890 and Mayor Chapman appointed a committee to present the matter to the city council.

"Resolved that it is the sense of this Board that the city council authorize the city Engineer to employ a competent assistant and go forward with and complete the work of replatting the city as soon as possible under his supervision"

Morgan Sr. addressed council upon the necessity of establishing grades on the streets and alleys preparatory to a system of sewerage and suggested the appointment of an advisory committee, or Board of Arbitration, to cooperate with council in the matter, and suggested the names of J. T. Maybrecht Frank Truman Major Cantine Jno Moore Henry Hen Sr. C. H. Rozpper D. Hording and T. R. Morgan Jr.

A communication from the Board of Trade recommending that in case such committee be appointed that the name of T. R. Morgan Sr. be added, having also been read.

"Be it resolved that it is the sense of this council that the committee spoken of by the Board of Trade and called Board of Arbitration be appointed as recommended by said Board of Trade"

The Claims ordinance having been prepared, and there not being sufficient money in certain funds, to pay the amounts called for in the ordinance Johnson moved that there be appropriated from the unapportioned fund to the General fund \$30⁰⁰, to the Street and Sanitary fund \$100⁰⁰ and to the Police and Salary fund \$157⁰⁰. Seconded by Braine and carried.
