Ordinance to

An Ordinance entitled an Ordinance to improve Oxford Street from the east side of Morgan Street to the west side of Seneca Street was read 2nd time. Moved by Bush seconded by Brinker the rules be suspended and the Ordinance be read 3rd time. The yeas and nays were called on the motion to suspend Resulting. Yeas Betts Bush Earley

Srferf, Miller, Hull, Johnson Brinker Crubough
 Penrock. Yeas 10. Nays none and the rules were
 declared suspended and the Ordinance was read third
 time, and a vote taken on the final passage resulting
 Yeas Betts, Bush, Carley Srferf Miller Hull
 Johnson Brinker Crubough Penrock.

Yeas 10 Nays none, and the Ordinance was declared
 passed. Moved by Hull, Seconded by Betts
 the vote on the adoption of the plans and
 Specifications for the improvement of Oxford
 Street be reconsidered. Carried.

Mayor Chapman stated that, the fines of John
 Lofters for \$500⁰⁰ and, Mary Bissler \$200⁰⁰ and
 for which bonds had been given, also the bond of
 Mrs Koch for her appearance before the Mayor's
 Court which had been declared forfeited, all of
 which were for violation of the prohibitory

Ordinance, were due and unpaid and
 on motion of Betts seconded by Johnson
 the Solicitor was instructed to proceed to
 collect the same.

 second time by title. Moved by Brinker
 seconded by Betts the rules be suspended and
 the ordinance be read ^{and placed on its final passage} third time, Carried

On Motion of Brinker the Engineer was instructed to make an estimate of the cost of improving west Main Street according to the plans and specifications adopted. Moved by Brinker seconded by Bush a committee of three be appointed to appraise the Disciple Church property in view of the proposed improvement of west Main Street, carried. and Brinker Hull and Crubaugh were appointed as said committee.

The bills of C. J. Kay for Mdse. Wm Autrin for interest and John Zimmer for Detective services were read and on Motion of Brinker seconded by Betts the Solicitor was instructed to prepare an Ordinance providing for their payment. Earley asked that there be a separate vote on the bill of John Zimmer.

The engineer read plans and specifications for the improvement of Oxford Street from Morgan to Seneca Street. Bush moved the same be adopted. seconded by Defert and carried. Yeas Betts Bush Earley Defert Miller Hull Johnson Brinker Crubaugh Penrock Yeas 10 nays 0. Moved by Bush seconded by Betts that the engineer make an estimate of the cost of the cost of said improvement in accordance with plans and specifications carried.

Moved by Johnson seconded by Betts that the sum of \$63⁰⁰ be apportioned from the unapportioned fund to the special fund for the enforcement of the prohibitory ordinance carried.

A vote was taken on the passage of the ordinance
without the bill of John Zimmer resulting
Yeas Betts Bush Carley Siefert. Miller Hull
Johnson Brinker Crubaugh Pennock.
Yeas 10 Nays none.

The yeas and nays were then called on the bill of John
Zimmer resulting yeas Betts Bush Hull Brinker
Johnson Crubaugh Pennock. Nays Carley Siefert. Miller
Yeas 7 nays 3. and the ordinance was declared
passed.

Hull of the committee appointed to confer with
Alliance Street R.R. Co. in regard to the amount due
the city from said company for Arch street
paving. reported that the claim against said

Company was \$2061.69. To which the company
claimed an offset to the amount of 1142.82
as follows. for gravel furnished between Broadway
and Summit Street \$570.00 to amt paid for
relaying. \$200.00. To 1/5 of paving 259.88
(The estimate of the city being ~~from~~ ^{between} outside of rails
when the franchise only requires between the inside)
and on contract \$112.94, which deducted from
the amount claimed by the city, left \$1418.86

The committee recommended that the claim
be settled upon the payment of the above amount
and Hull presented a check for the same
signed by Mr Hazzard of said company.
payable April 15 1890.

Moved by Johnson Seconded by Brinker.
The report be adopted upon the payment of
the above described check. Carried

An Ordinance entitled an Ordinance
to adopt Standard Time was read second
time. Moved by Hull seconded by Bush
the rules be suspended and the ordinance
be read third time and be placed on its
final passage. The yeas and nays were called
on the motion to suspend resulting Yeas
Betts Bush Defert Miller Hull Johnson
Brinker Orubough Penrock Nays
Earley Yeas 9 nays 1. and the rules
were declared suspended and the ordinance
was read third time and the yeas and
nays called on the final passage resulting
yeas Betts Bush Defert Miller Hull
Orubough Penrock nays Earley Johnson
Brinker Yeas 7 nays 3 and the
Ordinance was declared Passed

Passage of
Ordinance to
increase
Clerk's Salary

An Ordinance Entitled "An Ordinance to increase the compensation of certain Municipal Officers." was read second time. Moved by Betts seconded by Bush the rules be suspended and the Ordinance be read third time, carried. Yeas Betts Bush Siefert Miller, Hull, Johnson Brinker Burbough Remock. Nays, Early Yeas 9 nays none, one. Moved by Hull seconded by Johnson that the Ordinance be amended, so as to apply only to the Clerk of Cemetery, Trustee, and city Clerk and that the increase of the Mayor's and Solicitors Salary be stricken out, carried. The vote was then called on the final passage of the Ordinance, resulting Yeas Bush Siefert Miller Hull Brinker Johnson Remock, Nays, Betts Early Burbough. Yeas 7 nays 3, and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Betts presented proposed addition to the City by N. B. Spicer, and moved the same be accepted and the solicitor be instructed to prepare an Ordinance in accordance therewith carried.
