Organization of New Council. April 21st. 1890

The retiring council adjourned. Mayor Chapman occupied the chair as president Pro Tem. and called Council to order.

Certificates of election as councilmen having been issued to A Cowan. 1st ward. James Hymett 2nd ward. C. H. Bush 3rd ward.

David McLaughlin 4th ward P. D. Keplinger 5th ward. and Thomas Wilson 6th ward.

These names were called and all responded and Mayor Chapman administered ^{to} them the oath of office.

The roll was then called, and the following present. Brinker Bush Cowan Crubagh Hull Hartzell Hymett Keplinger McLaughlin Sefert Wilson. Absent Earley

President Pro Tem Chapman announced that ~~that~~ the election of President of Council for the ensuing year would be next in order and appointed Messrs Sefert and Hull as tellers.

Nominations being in order. Sefert nominated Mr Brinker Hartzell.

Nominated Mr Bush and Bush nominated Mr Hull. A ballot was taken resulting

Brinker 5 Hull 3 Bush 2. and pres Chapman declared no choice and ordered another ballot, which resulted Brinker 5 Hull 6. and pres pro tem Chapman declared, ^{April} elected and called him to the chair. President Hull made a few remarks returning his thanks to council for the honor conferred upon him.

Mayor Chapman thanked council for ~~and~~ their support and ~~kind~~ courtesy during his administration and introduced

Mayor Elect Jno M Stillwell. after a few remarks by Mayor Stillwell.

Brinker. Nominated. Thomas Wilson for Vice president. Seconded by Crubagh and carried unanimously. and Mr Wilson was declared elected Vice President
