

Council Chamber Minutes of July 21 1890

Council met in regular session with President Hull in the Chair and the following members present Brinker Bush Cowan Crumbaugh Early Hartzell Kiplinger Siefert Wilson Absent Kinnett & McLaughlin.

Report of Special committee

Brinker of the special committee appointed to attend to the case of Mrs Campbell vs the city reported having paid \$42.00 witness fees and that there yet remained \$58.00 in the hands of the committee and that E. N. Johnson desired to be relieved from said committee on motion of Bush the report was accepted and Brinker instructed to receipt to Mr E. N. Johnson for the balance of the money in the committees hands and take charge of the same.

An Ordinance Entitled
"An Ordinance to provide for the issuing of the Bonds of the City of Alliance for the purpose of extending the time of payment of certain indebtedness which from its limits of taxation said city is unable to pay at maturity" was read first time. Moved by Bush seconded by Brinker the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read second time by title. The yeas and nays were called on the motion to suspend resulting Yeas Brinker Bush Cowan Curbough Carley Hartzell Kiplinger Siefert Wilson Hull Yeas 10 Nays none. President Hull declared the rules suspended and the ordinance was read second time by title. Moved by Brinker seconded by Bush the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read third time and be placed on its final passage. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Brinker Bush Cowan Curbough Carley Hartzell Kiplinger Siefert Wilson Hull - Yeas 10 nays none

The rules were declared suspended the ordinance was read third time and the yeas and nays called on the final passage resulting yeas Brinker Bush Cowan Corbrough Carley Hartzell Keplinger Defert Hilson Hull. Yeas 10 nays none and President Hull declared the ordinance duly passed.

The ordinance was read third time and the yeas and nays called on the final passage of the same resulting yeas 10 nays 0 and the ordinance was declared duly passed.

report of Street Commissioners

The report of the Street Commissioners for the month of June showing the number of days worked and where the same was done was read.

On Motion of Carley seconded by Brinker the Judiciary Committee was instructed to investigate the matter of the Street Commissioner charging Mr. Hill with filling his lot, and report at next meeting.
