conduct was referred in the case of the filling of the lot of Mr Hill. find that Mr Bevington acted entirely in accordance with the instructions of the old committee and did not understand the wishes of the present committee in the matter and that he did not charge the city with the time while filling said lot and exonerate him from all blame and censure in the matter and further recommend that the amount charged by Mr Bevington for his work be refunded by the city to Mr Hill.

They further find fault with Mr Bevington in this. The number of teams employed by him in doing his work is disproportionate to the number of men employed. and think he is deserving of censure in this matter.
