

Alliance Ohio Feb 2^m 1891

Council met in regular session with president Hull in the Chair and the following members present.

Brinker, Bush, Cowan, Cornbaugh, Keplinger, Kymett, Love, Wilson. Absent Earley, Hartzell and Sefert. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Report of Finance committee on motion of Brinker seconded by Keplinger. The bills of A Lamott as Clerk of board of health and James Bates as health officer were referred to the Judiciary committee and Solicitor.

A number of bills for the month of January having been approved were read, and an ordinance ordered prepared providing for their payment.

There not being sufficient money in certain funds to pay claims in full. Brinker moved that there be apportioned from any unapportioned money in the city treasury to the general fund \$3500 and to the Police and salary fund \$1800 seconded by Keplinger and carried.

The Claims Ordinance being prepared, was read, and on motion of Brinker was placed on its passage. The yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 9 nays none and the ordinance was declared duly passed.

On Motion of Brinker the street committee was instructed to have Catch Basins built on South Freedom Street where the sewer now being constructed crosses said Freedom street.

Brinker reported bad place in the street on Broadway near the Reservoir caused by overflow of

Oxford Street in the city of Alliance Ohio
between Arch Street and Union Avenue
would respectfully ask the city council to
proceed with the improvement of Oxford Street
between the points aforesaid in accordance
with the petition of property owners therefor
now on file with the city clerk and in
consideration of the city council granting
this request we each of us do severally agree
to hold the said city free from all expense
in the construction of said improvement
arising by reason of our properties being
valued on the tax duplicate to low to
discharge and pay our full share of the cost
of said improvement and in consideration
as aforesaid we do hereby severally expressly
waive all our statutory rights and privileges
relating to the limitation of the city's power
to assess in such cases to twenty five per centum
of the value of the property as assessed for
taxation as provided in sec 2270. R.S. of Ohio.

The ordinance was read third time and the yeas and nays called on the final passage resulting same as before yeas 9 nays none. and president Hull declared the ordinance duly passed.

 defend the rights of the city in said
 action. seconded by Brinker and
 carried Yeas 9 nays none.

solicitor to
 get permis-

Bush offered the following
 resolution. "Be it resolved that it is the
 sense of this council that the city solicitor
 be and is hereby instructed to take the
 proper steps to secure permission from
 the legislature to issue the bonds in the
 sum of one thousand dollars for the
 purpose of laying sidewalks"

Love moved the adoption of the resolution seconded by Brinker and carried Yeas 9 nays none and the resolution was declared adopted.

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

"Be it resolved that it is the sense of this council that the action of the board of Trade in appointing a committee with instructions to interview the proper authorities at Columbus with a view to secure a better and more uniform equalization of the value of real estate be endorsed, as we feel that the property of the East end of the county is valued entirely too high, and compared to other sections of the state we find a very unjust valuation".

Kiplinger seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas 9 nays none.
