

Council Chamber Alliance 0 Feb 16. 1891

Council Met in regular session with Vice President Wilson presiding and the following members present. Brinker Bush Cowan Crubaugh. Early Keplinger Lane. absent. Hartzell Hull Siefert and Kymett Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

Petition for sidewalk on alley

A petition for sidewalk on the west side of <sup>first</sup> Alley west of Freedom Street and between Main and Market streets, was referred to sidewalk committee.

Petition against indecent show bills.

A Petition signed by citizens of sixth ward, petitioning against the posting of indecent show bills was read and on motion of Bush referred to the Judiciary committee.

Petition to improve Arch Street from Milner to South

A Petition representing more than two thirds of the frontage on Arch Street between Milner and State Street asking for the Macadamizing of said street was read and on motion of Brinker seconded by Lane referred to the Street committee and Solicitor.

Report of committee on Seneca at Brick

The committee to whom was referred the selection of Brick for the Seneca Street improvement reported that after examining a number of different kinds they would recommend that the brick manufactured by the Canton and Malvern fire brick paving co at Malvern be used. Brinker moved that the report be laid on the table for one week and that the Manufactures be required to furnish samples of brick such as they would furnish. Seconded by Early and carried.

Judiciary committee before Finance meeting

Brinker moved that when council adjourn it be to meet Monday evening Feb 23. seconded by Keplinger and carried.

F. W. Gastell addressed council in regard to the license for opera houses and asking council to make a reduction in the same and on motion of Brinker the matter was referred to the Judiciary committee with instructions to report at next meeting. and on motion of

Bush. The enforcement of the ordinance providing for said license was ordered suspended, until next meeting.

The Judiciary committee to whom was referred the matter of the fixing of salaries and paying bills of the Board of health reported that said Board of health had the power to fix the salary of its officers but not the power to issue orders on the city treasury, and that their bills must be passed on by the council and paid as all other bills, and on motion of Brinker the report was accepted.

Attention was called to the condition of the fire hose of the city and the necessity of having some suitable place to dry the same after use, and Brinker moved that a committee be appointed with power to act to secure plan and cost of a tower for that purpose, and erect the same. The cost not to ~~and~~ exceed one hundred and fifty (150) dollars. Seconded by Bush and carried.
