The Mayor's report for the month of February reporting fines collected to the amount of \$65⁰⁰ was read and on motion of Brinker the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A Petition signed by Jm Chambers and G. K. Pritchard asking permission to tap the Water Main and Catch basin at their property on Arch Street and to remove the pavement necessary and agreeing to replace the same in good condition was read and on motion of Brinker referred to the Street committee.

A communication from Edward Hebert calling attention to a narrow drive way at the north end of Park street was on motion of Wilson referred to the Street committee.

Brinker moved that the committee appointed to confer with the railroad officials in regard to the street crossings be empowered to bring before said officials all grievances of the city against the railroad company at this time. Seconded by Love and Carried.

A number of bills having been approved by the finance committee were read and an ordinance ordered prepared providing for their payment. The ordinance being prepared was read and on motion of Brinker seconded by Love was placed on its passage the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas 9 nays none and the ordinance was declared passed.

The Judiciary committee to whom was referred the petition against indecent shows and posters reported favorably to the request of the petitioners and on motion of Wilson the solicitor was instructed to prepare an ordinance therefor in accordance with the statutes.

Attention was called to bad sidewalks at the church property corner of Linden ave and Columbia Street also on Broadway at Goddards Rink and the same referred to the Sidewalk committee.

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

Be it resolved that it is the sense of this council that the Alliance Water Works Co be instructed to connect the Water Main beginning at the corner of Market and Seneca streets thence south on Seneca Street to the corner of Columbia Street and Seneca and ~~have~~ to place or have placed one fire plug at the corner of Seneca and Market streets. partitions, cells and stones be removed,
and sold. Throwing the entire inside
into one room, and by purchasing
one new stove make the building suitable
for a ward house

The Sewerage Committee submitted
a report recommending the adoption of the
report and plans of Col. Waring in
regard to Sewer System, and recommending
necessity of immediate action, by
council in the matter. and on
motion of Brinker the same was
accepted and ordered placed on file.

Keplinger offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. "Be it resolved by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio that the general assembly of the state of Ohio be petitioned to grant this council the authority to issue the bonds of the city in the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) the proceeds thereof to be used for sewerage purposes and permanent street improvements.

Resolved that a committee consisting of William Brinker, C. N. Bush and Thomas Wilson be appointed to present to the general assembly the necessities of the case as soon as practicable?"

Love seconded the motion to adopt. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas 9 nays 0. and the resolution was declared adopted.

Brinker moved that M. H. Cantine be added to the committee provided for in the resolution. Seconded by Wilson and carried.

Brinker moved that the expenses of said committee in going to Columbus be paid by the city seconded by Love and carried yeas 9 nays none.

Brinker moved that there be apportioned from any unapportioned money in the city treasury to the general fund the sum of \$75.00. Seconded by Keplinger and carried.

Brinker moved that an Ordinance be prepared providing for the payment to C. N. Bush of \$75.00 out of the general fund for the purpose of defraying the expense of said committee. seconded by Love and carried.

The Ordinance being prepared was read and on Motion of Brinker seconded by Wilson was placed on its passage. The yeas and nays were called on the passage of the same resulting Yeas 9 nays none.

resolution denouncing city of Canton

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. "Be it resolved that it is the sense of this Council that we denounce the action taken by the city of Canton in taxing the property of the entire county for the purpose of erecting a public building to be called Memorial Hall. which we feel would be a burden on all the property owners of the county benefiting no one outside of the city of Canton." Keplinger seconded the motion to adopt the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Brinker Bush Cowan Crubaugh Keplinger Love Defert Hull. Nay. Wilson yeas 8 nays 1 and the resolution was declared adopted.
