

Alliance Ohio. March 16th 1891

Council met in regular session with President Hull in the chair and the following members present, Brinker Bush Cowan Crubough Earley Keplinger Love Wilson absent Seft Kynett Starfall. Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved. a petition from residents of the first ward, asking for sidewalk on ~~north side~~ of ~~Haynes Street~~ the west side of Union ave from the C & P R.R. to Wayne street also on Wayne street between Union Ave and Park st also for Electric light and street crossings was on motion of Wilson referred to the sidewalk committee, to report at next meeting

Brinker reported that

The costs in the Lacy case amounting to \$265²⁶ was past due and that O. W. Coxan would pay the same on the ^{approval} acceptance of the bill by council, and I hold the bill until such time as the city could lift it.

and moved the same be accepted seconded by Wilson and carried Yeas 8 nays none.

Bush reported bad condition of bridge in first near old gas well, and the same was referred to the street committee

attention was called to the dangerous condition of Union Ave near the R R Bridge, and on motion of Wilson the street committee was instructed to call the attention of the street committee to the same.

Brinker moved that there be a committee of five appointed to ^{determine} the uses to which the \$50000⁰⁰ proposed to be secured for sewerage and street improvements shall be used, seconded by Keplinger and carried.

President Hull appointed Messrs Brinker Earley Love Bush & Crubough.

Brinker moved that the engineer and the citizens committee on the improvement of Webb street be empowered to make any changes in

it is with profound sorrow that we learned of
of the death of our honored Solicitor

J. L. Phillips on the 7th day of March 1841

In his death we recognize the loss
of one of our most honorable, faithful
and diligent city officials, a man who
in his official capacity commanded the
respect of all who knew him, a man who
to know was to love and respect.

He was ever ready to defend the right
or prosecute the wrong, as an attorney he
stood prominently as one of the most
logical exponents, as a friend he was ever
true. No change wrought by time or
circumstances affected his regard for
those to whom he was attached.

He was a man in all that that name
implies. To his stricken relatives we
would say, if the sympathy of friends
be any consolation under these trying
circumstances, be assured that all who
knew him share in your sorrow.

For this loss, his death, teaches us that
sooner or later we must all make the
Journey across the Mystic River

it is the sense of this council that a committee
consisting of City Clerk and Tom Brinker be
instructed to go to Cleveland as soon as possible
to complete the contract for the sale of bonds
for the improvement of North Webb, Seneca and
Patterson streets which were this day sold to
Stygo & Sons. provided that the expense of this
work be charged to the street improvements."
seconded by Wilson and carried yeas 9 nays 0

On motion of Brinker seconded
by Wilson the engineer was instructed to
prepare contracts for the improvement of
North Webb, Seneca, and Patterson streets
in accordance with plans and specifications

The matter of securing suitable
places to which to attach mail boxes in
connection with free delivery, was on motion
of Bush referred to a committee of three
consisting of Bush, Cowan and Wilson.

On motion of Bush the Mayor
was instructed to correspond with the city's attorney
in the case of the city against Joyce in the
supreme court, that they use their endeavors
to secure an early decision of the same.

Passage

Vote on
ordinance

An Ordinance to amend section
eight of an Ordinance to provide for the
granting of licenses, was read third time.

Brinker moved that it be amended to tax Opera
houses, \$200.00 per year instead of \$50.00 seconded by
Keplinger and lost. yeas Brinker Keplinger nays Bush Embury
Love Wilson, Hull yeas 2 nays 5. The yeas and nays were
then called on the final passage of the ordinance
resulting yeas Brinker, Love, Hull, nays Bush
Embury, Keplinger Wilson. yeas 3 nays 4
and the same was declared lost.

No further business council adjourned
to meet Monday evening March 23^d
