 the \$50000⁰⁰

The committee to whom
 was referred the matter of determining
 in what manner the \$50000⁰⁰ that it
 was proposed to borrow should be used
 reported as follows:

To the Council of the city of Alliance
 Ohio. We your committee appointed to
 determine the purposes to which \$50000⁰⁰
 to be voted for at a special election shall
 be applied we leave to report as follows;

Beginning at a point below the
 dam running a complete system of Main
 sewerage throughout the first and second
 wards extending as far south as can be
 practically done carrying all sewerage
 and storm water under all ordinary
 circumstances. plans and specifications
 to be furnished by the sewerage commissioner
 and to be approved by the Council

And the \$20000⁰⁰ for the street improvements
 be applied as follows: \$6000⁰⁰ for the purpose
 of securing a practical and safe crossing
 from the east end of Main street crossing
 the P. F. A. & C. R. R. yards to the second ward
 \$2000⁰⁰ for the approaches to the Rock hill
 Road bridge the remainder to be placed
 in the permanent street improvement
 fund for the purpose of paying the
 city's share of the street improvements
 that have been made and that are to
 be made

final passage of the ordinance to amend
Section VIII of An Ordinance to provide for the
granting of licenses be reconsidered. seconded
by Bush and carried Yeas 10 nays none.

resulting Yeas Brinker Bush Cowan
Crumbaugh Keplinger Love Wilson Hull
Nays Earley Ynnett. yeas 8 nays 2.

recent date. Earley moved to amend
by substituting M. M. Roach for Mr

motion to amend. resulting Yeas Cowan
Earley Love Hull. Nays Brinker
Bush Crumbaugh Wilson Keplinger Ynnett.
Yeas 4 nays 6. and the motion was
declared lost. The yeas and nays

were then called on the original motion

(the same having been seconded by Wilson)
resulting Yeas Brinker Bush Crumbaugh
Keplinger Love Wilson Hull Nays

Earley Cowan Ynnett. Yeas 7 nays 3
and the motion was declared carried.

President. Hull appointed. Bush Cowan and Keplinger as said committee.

Brinker moved that the matter of submitting the proposition of ^{issuing} bonds for \$50000 for sewerage and street improvements as provided by special act of the Legislature be deferred until some future time and a special election be held for the same. Seconded by Keplinger and carried. Yeas Brinker Bush Cowan Keplinger Love Wilson Hull. Nays Carley Kymett Cowan. Yeas 7 nays 3

Bush called attention to the bad condition of sidewalk on College street west of Union avenue. and on motion the same was referred to the ^{street} sidewalk committee with power to act.

St. R. R Co
to have gongs

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption. As it resolved that it is the sense of this council that the Alliance street R R Co be required to place or have placed upon each of their cars a gong for the purpose of warning pedestrians of their approach. and that the same be done within 30 days and that the manager of the street R R Co be served with a copy of this resolution by the city Marshal. seconded by Love and carried Yeas 10 nays 0
