elected, and on motion of Bush the

same was made unanimous.

Nominations for Vice President being

next in order. Keplinger nominated

Chas. H. Bush. Jenkins nominated

R.S. Kaylor. Earley nominated

Jno Devine. Mr Kaylor declined to

be a candidate. a ballot was taken resulting

Bush 6. Kaylor 1 Devine 5. and

Mr Bush was declared elected as Vice

president.

The Election of City Clerk being next

in order. Brinker nominated.

Thomas Casselman there being

no other nominations. The roll was

called on the confirmation of the

nomination resulting. Yeas

 Permanent Street improvement committee.

Seconded by Keplinger and carried
 Yeas Brinker, Cowan, Crumbaugh,
 Devine, Kaylor, Keplinger, Love, Hilson
 Kays, Rush Carley Jenkins
 Kynett. Yeas 8. nays 4.

Brinker moved. the committee of the whole
 rise and report. seconded by Carley and carried

The Clerk then reported the work of the
 committee ^{as above} and Jenkins moved the report
 be adopted. seconded by Devine and Carried
