

Alliance O. July 20th 1891

The question of the vacation of the Alley between the properties of S. J. Williams and R. W. Teters as petitioned for, was called up and on motion of Brinker. The petition for and the remonstrance against the same were referred to the Judiciary Committee with instruction to report at next meeting.

Bush offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

Westover to
grade Street

Be it resolved that it is the sense of this Council that J. G. Westover be allowed to proceed to excavate and put to grade the first street west of Trails run running south of Patterson street for a distance of at least three hundred feet south from Patterson street and that he be allowed to ~~use~~ use the earth for his own use for doing the work. The work to be done under the supervision of the grade committee."

On Motion of Bush The Light Committee was instructed to have the Lamp post at the corner of Market and Seneca Streets taken out.

On Motion of Brinker The Councilmen of each Ward were instructed to look up suitable rooms for Ward Polling places in which to hold the fall election.

Brinker offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

Be it resolved that the difficulty arising from fences being off the lot lines as platted in Webb's addition be referred to the platting commission with power to change the location of Keystone Street if the same can be done without expense to the city for the purchase of land. The Citizens committee on the improvement of Main Street between Mechanic Street and Union Avenue, made following report:

While we are not ^{satisfied} that the work was done in the best manner possible, or as well as one had a right to expect yet we have no desire to delay the contractor in getting his pay but only wish to secure the property owners and the city against possible loss. Therefore we would recommend that the balance of the money due Mr Shaffer be paid to him when he gives a guarantee to be approved by the Council conditioned that he will repair and make good at his own expense any settlements or defects which may appear in the improvement within one year from this date, and which are caused by neglect or omissions on his part as Contractor in making the improvement.

In consideration of the city paying the full amount of money on the Contract for the paving of Main Street between Mechanic Street and Union Avenue.

Before the final acceptance of the work, I hereby promise and guarantee to repair and make good at my own expense any defects or settlements that may appear in said improvement within one year from this date, if said defects or settlements were caused by neglect or omissions on my part as contractor in doing the work, and if after a reasonable notice from the Council I fail or neglect to make the required repairs the improvement committee may have the work done at my expense.
