

Alliance Ohio August 3^d 1891

Council met in regular session with president Wilson Presiding and the following members present. Bush Cowan Loubanugh Earley Jenkins Kayler Kynett. Love. Absent Brinker. Devine Keplinger.

The minutes of preceding meetings read and approved.

Mayor's report

The Mayor's report for month of July reporting fines and licenses to the amount of \$35⁰⁰ collected was read and on motion of Bush the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Marshal's return of sidewalk notices

The report of the Marshal of having served notice of the passage of resolutions to construct sidewalks on Jacob Snyder Lot no 1. Grants addition and E.C. Walton Lot " 527 T.L. Co's Addition was read.

Communication
from Trustees
of Mt Union
College

A communication from the Trustees of the Mt Union College, asking that Council take necessary steps to improve the sanitary condition of the 6th ward was presented and Kayler moved that a committee consisting of two members of council and two residents of the 6th ward be appointed to take charge of the same seconded by Bush and carried. President Wilson then appointed Messrs Kayler & Bush

as Council members and Messrs John Stamp and William Chain citizen members of said committee. with the request to report on the communication as soon as practicable. The members of the committee present retired for consultation, and upon their return, offered a resolution endorsing the action of the Trustees in interest taken, and pledging the hearty cooperation of Council in improving the sanitary condition of the ward. Bush moved the adoption of the resolution seconded by Kayler and carried Yeas 9 nays none.

Damage to
Jas Heirich's
property on
Lincoln ave

Mr J. W. Coaine being present stated in behalf of Mr Heirich that his property on Lincoln Avenue had been damaged by reason of the fill recently made on said Lincoln Avenue between Main Street and the Railroad and asked that Council take some action in the matter, and a motion by Love to refer the matter to the Permanent Street Improvement Committee was lost and on motion of Bush the same was referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Reading of bills

A number of bills having been approved by the finance committee were read, and Love moved that an ordinance be prepared providing for their payment, seconded by Jenkins ~~and~~ carried. on motion of Love there was apportioned from the unapportioned fund, to the Police and Salary fund \$21⁰⁰.

Rejection of
Learmouth
bill

Bush called for separate vote on the bill of Learmouth Bros for estimate on West main street contract, of \$672⁰⁰. The yeas and nays called, resulting for the payment of the bill, Crumbaugh Jenkins Love, Wilson, against the payment Bush Cowan, Earley Kayler Kynett, for payment 4 against 5. The bill was ordered left out of the ordinance and the ordinance providing for the payment of the rest of the bills was read

Passage of
Claims ordinance

and the yeas and nays called on the passage of the same resulting Yeas 9 nays 0 and the ordinance was declared Passed.

On Motion of Kayler the Clerk was instructed to notify the owner of the Freer property on Arch Street to move building off the alley in the rear of said property.

The matter of A.B. Shilling occupying a portion of Hester Avenue for office and scales was referred to the street committee to report at next meeting.

Bush moved that the engineer be instructed to drive the grade stakes on Union Avenue between Main Street and the P.F.W & C R.R. bridge one foot lower than they are at present. Seconded by Kayler. the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Bush Cowan Carley Kayler Wilson. Nays Cornbough Jenkins Hyonett Love. Yeas 5 nays 4 and the motion was declared carried.

The matter of filling the approaches to the new bridge at the south end of Liberty Street built by the county commissioners was referred to the street committee with instructions to have the township trustees do the same.

The Judiciary committee to whom had been referred the petition for grade on Columbia Street reported in favor of running the grade from Union Avenue to the C. & P. R.R. and on motion of Bush the Petition was then referred to the Grade committee.

Resolution to construct a sidewalk in front of lot no 6, Swains Addition was read and on motion of Jenkins seconded by Kayler the same was adopted Yeas 9 nays 0. also one for the west side of Lot 14 J.B. Widners 1st add on Motion of Kayler seconded by Carley adopted Yeas 9 nays 0.

An Ordinance to amend the Grade on Broadway was read first time.
