and the motion was declared lost.

Brinker moved that the

committee with instructions to inform  
Mr Shaffer the contractor. Just what  
they wanted done to make a satisfactory  
completion of the work. seconded by  
Bush and carried.

A Resolution requiring the owner  
of Lot No 51 and south part of 52. Webb's add.  
on North Webb street. (Mrs Hull) to construct  
sidewalk on east end of said lots was  
read. Bush moved the adoption of the  
same seconded by Kayler and carried  
yeas 9 nays none.

Also a resolution requiring John  
Fagley the owner of a piece of land in  
J. N. Webb's addition fronting on North  
Webb Street to construct sidewalk at  
east end of said piece of land was  
read and Kayler moved the adoption of  
the same seconded by Jenkins and  
carried yeas 9 nays none.

A Resolution requiring E. H.  
Boosius the owner of Lot no 59. in  
Webb's addition to construct a sidewalk at  
the east end of said lot was read  
and Brinker moved the adoption of the  
same seconded by Cumbough and  
carried yeas 9 nays none.

A resolution requiring Henry  
Martin the owner of Lot 23. Mt Union to  
construct sidewalk in front of said  
Lot 23. was read. and on motion of  
Bush seconded by Devine the resolution  
was adopted yeas 9 nays none.

on motion of Brinker seconded by

Buildings and grounds com. On Motion of Jenkins seconded by Kayler. The committee on building and grounds was instructed to have a sidewalk constructed at the south side of the city lots on Market Street said sidewalk to be of flag stone and six feet wide. Yeas 9 nays none.

Bad sewers referred. Kayler bad sanitary condition on account of defective drainage at the corner of Main and Arch streets. and at the Boarding hall on Linden Avenue also immediately north of the Coates shops. and the same was referred to the sewer committee with power to act.

Location of Telephone in 6th ward On Motion of Bush seconded by Kayler the Telephone company was instructed to place the free telephone in the 6th ward in the room now occupied by Mr Chain. on the south east corner of the square.

Appointment of Citizens committee on The appointment of a citizens committee on the proposed improvement of Linden Avenue was referred to property owners on the street to recommend the same by petition.

A motion by Jenkins seconded by Kayler to instruct the Clerk to advertise for bids for the improvement of South Liberty street Patterson Street and Linden Avenue upon the expiration ten days from the publication of the ordinances providing for the said improvements was lost. Yeas Bush, Jenkins, Kayler, Keplinger, Nays Brinker, Crubaugh, Devine, Love, Wilson. Yeas. 4 nays 5.

~~An Ordinance to amend the grade on Broadway was read second time~~

1st & second reading of An Ordinance to amend the grade on Linden Ave was read first time and on motion of Bush seconded by Brinker yeas 9 nays 0. The rules were suspended and the ordinance read second time by title.
