shall be fined in a sum not to exceed Five  
dollars, nor less than twenty five cents, or be  
imprisoned in the County jail not more than  
twenty days nor less than three days at the  
discretion of the Mayor,

Sec 2 And Be it further Ordained that if any  
or persons shall hear any person making  
aforesaid profane language, and shall  
oath before the Mayor, it shall be the duty

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
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
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

- Section 3. And that the Mayor, Marshal or other officer, in whose hands any money may be, by virtue of the first section of this ordinance, is hereby required, when he pays the same to the Treasurer, to take his receipt for the same and deposit it with the Recorder.
- Section 4. And it is hereby made the duty of the Recorder to open an account with said Treasurer, charging him with all money thus paid into the Treasury and credit him with all moneys paid out on the orders, the Council or their order and also to settle with said Treasurer at least ten days before each annual election for the Incorporation Officers and post up in some conspicuous place, at the place of holding election a balance sheet of the same.

An Ordinance against Profane Swearing.

*Spent new  
12/5/54*

Section 1. Be it ordained by the town Council of Alliance That any person of the age of ten years and upwards, who shall profanely curse, or damn, or profanely swear by the name of God, or Jesus Christ, or the Holy Ghost, each and every person so offending shall be fined in a sum not to exceed five dollars nor less than twenty-five cents, or be imprisoned in the county jail not more than twenty days, nor less than three days at the discretion of the Mayor.

Section 2. And be it further ordained that if any person or persons shall hear any person making use of aforesaid profane language and shall make oath before the Mayor, it shall be the duty of said Mayor to issue a warrant and cause the offender against this ordinance to be brought to trial.

Section 3. And be it further ordained that the parents and guardians of minors shall be made responsible for fines assessed against persons being minors, offending against said Ordinance.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on and after the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November A. D. 1854.

An Ordinance defining the stile of Process in Suits.

Section 1<sup>st</sup>

Be it ordained by the town Council of Alliance That the stile of process for the violation of any of the penal ordinances of the Incorporation shall be the Incorporated Village of Alliance; and all prosecutions for the same shall be carried on in the name and by the authority of the same.

Section 2.

In all prosecutions for the violation of any of the Provisions of any penal ordinance of the Incorporated Village of Alliance, said Corporation shall be liable for the same in case the Incorporation fail in the suit.
