The engineer and Citizens committee on the improvement of South Arch street submitted amended specifications. Changing the original specifications so as to read. 13 inches below sub grade at the ends of the ties and 19 " " " " at the curbs with a trench 15 " wide at the top and 9 inches wide at the bottom and 2 feet deep and instead of a four inch socket tile, four inch tile. also changing the rate of slope on the surface from the ends of the ties from ten inches to six inches in 13 feet with gutters 7 inches below the top of the curbs instead of 12 inches.

with a report of the above committee authorizing the above changes and recommending the work to be done in accordance therewith.

Brinker moved the adoption of the report seconded by Keplinger and carried Yeas 10 nays 0.

A Petition from the property owners on said South Arch street asking that the above change in tile be adopted having been presented.

An Ordinance to assess a special tax on the real estate bounding on South Arch Avenue from Milner Street South to State Street and to issue bonds in anticipation of the collection of such assessments was read the first time and on motion of Love seconded by Jenkins yeas 9 nays 0 the rules were suspended and the ordinance ordered read second time by title. The ordinance was read second time by title and Jenkins moved the rules be suspended and the ordinance

be read third time and be placed on its final passage. seconded by Love and carried, yeas 9 nays 0.

The Ordinance was read third time and the yeas and nays called on the final passage of the same resulting yeas Brinker Bush Cornburgh - Divine Jenkins Kayler Keplinger Love Wilson yeas 9 nays none, and the Ordinance was declared passed.

Ordinance to

An Ordinance to Amend the grade on Arch Avenue was read first-time and on motion of Jenkins seconded by Divine yeas 9 nays 0. The rules were suspended and the ordinance read second time by title and on motion of Brinker seconded by Jenkins the rules were again suspended and the Ordinance read third time and placed on its final passage the vote was called on the final passage resulting yeas Brinker Bush Cornburgh Divine Jenkins Kayler Keplinger Love Wilson, yeas 9 nays 0 and the Ordinance was declared passed.

On motion of Bush the room owned by John Bartley on South Liberty Street was designated as the place to hold the election in the 3d ward. and on motion of Brinker the fire engine room in the City building was designated as the place of holding the election in the fourth Ward.
