

Alliance Ohio June 20<sup>th</sup> 1892

Council met in regular session with Vice President - Bush in the Chair and the following members present. Brinker Cowan Embaugh. Divine Gabele Jenkins Kayler Love Wilson arriving during the session. absent Earley & Buck. Minutes of preceding meetings read and approved.

Bill of Water Works fee

A bill of the Alliance Water works fee for \$960<sup>00</sup> for one quarters hydrant rental claimed to be yet due on the old Contract was presented and on motion of Brinker seconded by Jenkins was referred to the Water and finance Committee.

insurance on City Hall

Brinker called attention of Council to the fact of the insurance on city hall having expired and stated that a new policy had been written and the same was submitted to council and Brinker moved the same be accepted seconded by Love and carried. Gias & Stays none.

Petition to vacate portion of Harrison st

The Buildings and Grounds committee was instructed to ascertain whether the city building in the 6<sup>th</sup> ward was insured or not.

A petition from property owners on Harrison Street - asking that said street be left 30 feet wide from Union Avenue to Sester Avenue instead of widening it from Park to Union Avenue. was referred to the platting Commission

Petition for sidewalk maintain at

A Petition from residents of West main Street asking that a sidewalk be ordered in front of the J. N. Ramsey and L. L. Lamborn properties was referred to the sidewalk Committee

Petition for water on 11<sup>th</sup> st

A Petition from property owners on Eleventh Street asking for water Main on said Street from Arch Street to the L. C. & S. R.R. and the erection of a plug at the intersection of Highland Avenue and Eleventh Street was referred to the water Committee

Duck Sewer

Love called attention to the condition of what is known as the Funk Sewer and moved the same be referred to the Street and Finance Committees to devise means to have the same fixed to carry off surplus water.

Sidewalk Resolutions

Resolutions requiring property owners to construct sidewalks was read as follows:

The resolutions ordering above sidewalks were read separately and the yeas and nays called on each. resulting yeas 8 nays 0. and said resolutions were declared adopted

Clerk notify Property Owners to lay Sidewalks

On Motion of Kayler the Clerk was instructed to notify property owners who has heretofore been given notice to construct walks to construct the same above or ~~if~~ it would be done by the city.

Cemetery Committee 6th Ward Cemetery

On Motion of Devine the Chairman of the Cemetery Committee was instructed to notify the Cemetery trustees to look after the cemetery in the 6th ward and see that the law was complied with with reference to removing bodies and leaving graves open.

Petitions for Ely st

Petitions signed by property owners on Ely Street from park to west Corporation line were read and on motion of Brinker seconded by Devine were referred to the Grade Committee

Be the undersigned committee to whom was referred the resolution to report on the best method of dealing with the liquor traffic in the city after taking as good legal advice as there is in the county beg leave to report as follows:

1<sup>st</sup> That the city Councilmen as officers have no authority and it is not their duty to enforce any of the ordinances of the city

2<sup>nd</sup> That the council has no authority to appropriate money to secure evidence against violators of the ordinances of the city.

3<sup>d</sup> That the duty of enforcing the ordinances of the city is devolved by law upon the executive officers of the city namely, the Mayor, Marshal and policemen and also upon the citizens of the city

The following resolution was read.

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio that the Mayor, Marshal and policemen of this city be requested to use every effort in their power to enforce the prohibitory and all other ordinances of this city"

Brinker moved the adoption of the resolution seconded by Wilson and carried Yeas: Brinker Bush Cowan Crubbaugh Quome Gable Jenkins Kayler Loue Wilson. Yeas 10 nays 0.

"An Ordinance to provide for safety to persons and property by requiring the erection and maintenance of safe guards for the prevention of contact between different electrical systems" and on motion of Brinker seconded by Wilson the same was referred to the Judiciary Committee and Solicitor

Grant Street  
Grade ordinance

An Ordinance to amend the grade on Grant Street was read second time and Love moved the rules be suspended and the ordinance be read third time and be placed on its final passage. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas 10 yeas 0 and the motion was declared lost and on motion of Brinker the ordinance was referred back to the Grade Committee and Engineer to report at next meeting.

Ordinance to  
assess sidewalk  
tax

An Ordinance to assess a special tax on lots and subdivisions hereinafter described to pay construction of sidewalks in front of said lots was read and Brinker moved the same be placed on its passage. Seconded by Wilson the yeas and nays were called resulting yeas Brinker Bush Cowan Corbrough Davine Gabele Jenkins Kayler Love Wilson Yeas 10 nays 0 and the ordinance was declared passed.

Telegraph

On motion of Jenkins the Clerk was instructed to notify the Postal Telegraph Co. to substitute longer poles for those now placed on South Liberty Street between Summit and Milner Streets and to set said poles back inside the curb line.

Wilson moved that there be a committee of three appointed to look after the city's interest in the cases now pending of their against the city and Weirich against the city with power to employ additional legal assistance if necessary. Seconded by Brinker and carried Yeas 10 nays 0. and President Bush appointed Wilson Brinker and Love as said committee.
