A communication from
J R Morgan Sr asking for the vacation
of ^{part of} an alley running north and south
between Seneca and Liberty avenues
was on Motion of Brinker referred to
the street committee with instructions
to report at their earliest convenience.

A Petition for the
improvement of Market Street between
Arch and Union Avenues by paving was
read and on Motion of Brinker the
same was referred to the street committee
with instructions to report as soon
as convenient also to report the
Valuation of the property abutting thereon

report of
Committee
on Water
Works bill

Brinker of the Committee
having been to whom had been referred the
the Bill of the Water Works Company
for one quarter's Hydrant Rental claimed
to be yet due on the old Contract
reported as having made a thorough examination
of the books and vouchers and found
that according to the same all payments
due had been paid from Oct 13. 1846
to the expiration of the Contract

but could find no record of the quarter from July 13. 1886 to Oct 13 1886 having been paid. and that according to the time the different Hydrants were erected and the amount of Money paid for the same there was yet due the said water works Company \$741⁰⁰

On Motion of Devine the report was referred back to the Committee and Clerk to report the amount of money apportioned to the water fund since said fund was created

Finance Committee

On Motion of Brinker the bills of Mayor Excell for witness fees in the case of the City vs Loftus and the bill of Geo McFarland for boarding prisoners were referred to the Judiciary Committee and Solicitor.

A number of bills against the city having been approved by the proper committees were read and Brinker moved the same be placed in an ordinance providing for their payment seconded by Buck and carried.

The ordinance being prepared was on Motion of Devine ordered read.

On Motion of Brinker there was apportioned from the unapportioned fund to the general fund \$100⁰⁰ to the street fund \$200⁰⁰ and to the sanitary fund \$1⁰⁰.

The ordinance was then read and Love moved the passage of the same seconded by Buck. The yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas Brinker Bush Buck Corbin Orsbrough Devine Earley Goble Jenkins Kuyler Love. Yeas 11 nays 0. and the ordinance was declared passed.

Brinker reported to Council that propositions had been made for the settlement of some liquor cases viz the city against Loftus 2 cases against Tierney and Strzelle. and moved that a committee be

Catch
 basin on
 S Freedom

Kayler called attention to the necessity
 of a catch basin on South Freedom Street near
 Mr Pullis' property also one where the first-ally
 west of ~~Union~~ Arch street intersects Milner street
 and moved the same be referred to the street
 committee with power to act. see by Jenkins
 and carried yeas 11 nays 0

Repair street
 crossings

Attention was called to the
 bad condition of the street crossings on the
 west-side of Linden Avenue at the intersection of
 Oxford Street and on North Freedom Street
 at the intersection of the first-ally north of
 Broadway. and Jenkins moved the matter
 be referred to the street committee with
 power to act seconded by Kayler and
 Carried yeas 11 nays 0.

Gravel for
 N Union
 Avenue

Love stated that J. C. Carley and
 others would furnish teams and haul gravel
 on North Union Avenue ^{free of charge} if the City would
 pay for the gravel and moved that the proposition
 be referred to the street committee seconded
 by Jenkins and carried.

Bad
 sidewalk
 on Patterson
 Street

The sidewalk on the north side of
 Patterson Street and immediately west of the
 C & P R.R. was reported in bad condition
 and on motion of Kayler seconded by Brinker
 the same was referred to the sidewalk
 committee with power to act yeas 11 nays 0

The committee to whom had been
 referred the Grant-Street Grade Ordinance reported
 as follows: In the matter of the Grant-Street
 Grade which was referred ^{back} to the grade committee
 we would respectfully recommend that the
 ordinance be passed as originally made.
 signed A. B. Love. C. H. Bush.

Love moved the adoption of the report
 seconded by Brinker and carried. yeas

time and Love moved the final passage
of the same seconded by Buck. The yeas
and nays were called resulting yeas
Brinker Buck Bush Lewan Lombough

Hay Jenkins. Yeas 10 nays 1 and the
Ordinance was declared passed.

Ely Street
Grade
Ordinance

An Ordinance to amend
the grade on Ely Street was read first
time and Love moved the rules
be suspended and that the ordinance
be read second time by title seconded by
Brinker and carried. Yeas Brinker Buck
Bush Lewan Lombough Divine Early
Gabelle Jenkins Kayler Love Yeas 11
nays 0 The ordinance was read second
time by title and Jenkins moved the
rules be suspended and the ordinance
be read third time and be placed on
its final passage seconded by Kayler. The
Yeas and nays were called resulting Yeas
Buck Bush Lombough Divine Gabelle
Jenkins Kayler Love Nays Brinker
Lewan Early. The necessary $\frac{3}{4}$ of the
members not voting in the affirmative the
motion was declared lost.

An Ordinance to
amend the grade on College
Street was read first time and on
motion of Love seconded by Brinker
Yeas 11 nays 0 The rules were

Suspended and the ordinance read second time by title and on Motion of Love seconded by Devine yeas 11 nays 0 the rules were again suspended and the ordinance read third time and placed on its final passage. The yeas and nays on the final passage being yeas Brinker Buck Bush Cowan Crumbaugh Devine J. Carley Gabele Jenkins Kayler Love yeas 11 nays 0. and the ordinance was declared passed.

Carley stated M. C. Spicer, desired to resign as member of the board of health from the first ward. and moved that George Rickard be elected to fill the vacancy seconded by Gabele and Carried.

The term of the members of the Board of health from the 3rd and 6th wards having expired. Buck moved that James Gilbert be appointed from the 5th ward for the ensuing term seconded by Brinker and Carried.

Crumbaugh moved that William Hoiles be appointed from the 6th ward. seconded by Brinker and Carried.

Engineer
at-stakes

On Motion of Brinker the Engineer was instructed to set grade stakes for sidewalk for the overhaul factory on Market and Mechanic Streets.

Report of
Water
Committee

The water Committee to whom had been referred the petition for water main on Eleventh Street reported in favor of Granting the request of the petitioners. and Love stated that in consideration of the same being granted that the petitioners would pay the rental for one hydrant for one year. and moved that the water works Company be instructed to lay pipes and erect a hydrant as petitioned for seconded by Buck.

Brinker moved the matter lay on the table for one week seconded by Devine and Carried.
